Now is the time to send in your photos of your family dog in order to enter **Barnstable's Best Dog Contest for 2015!** Starting on April 1st, send in your dog's photo (put your name and address on the back) along with a check for your license. Don't forget to come in and vote too! The contest ends on **April 30th**. Once the contest is over we will return the photo and your new license to you. Maybe your dog will win the #1 tag! The actual dog licenses will not be issued until May 6th.

Barnstable's Best Dog contest:

- √ a stamped self-addressed envelope;
- √ Include a check for \$7.00 for a spayed or neutered animal;
- $\sqrt{}$ or \$10.00 for a male or female dog;
- √ a copy of the current rabies certificate (if it has been updated recently); and
- √ Mail all of the above to: Town Clerk, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA 02601.

The winner of Barnstable's Best Dog will receive the #1 tag and his/her photo will be on the Barnstable website for the coming year. We will accept photos until noon on the 30th of April. Barnstable's Recent Achievements in Academics and Athletics

<u>The Joshua Boger Innovative School of the Year from the Massachusetts Biotechnology</u> Education Foundation

Barnstable High School has been selected by the MassBioEd Foundation as The Joshua Boger Innovative School of the Year. Barnstable High School received this award for its commitment to engaging students at all levels in hands-on biotechnology experiences and for our "Biotech Bio-wide" goal to expose all Barnstable High's life science students to biotechnolgy. MassBioEd Foundation stated "in the short time since your BioTeach award in 2013, Barnstable HighSchool has added a Forensics and Biotechnology class and a Pathology and Biotechnology class. The popularity of these classes as measured by student enrollment indicates that you and your team are increasing the number of students who are well-versed in biotechnology, inspired to pursue STEM courses in high school and college and who are knowledgeable about careers in the life sciences. You have also enriched the science program at Barnstable High School by developing external partnerships and by introducing student-driven research projects. We are happy to note that you and your team have leveraged the BioTeach award to secure additional funding that will continue to support and grow your life sciences and biotechnology programs. Barnstable High School's commitment to bringing cutting-edge biotechnology experiences to its students is inspiring. Superintendent Academic Excellence Awards

The Superintendent Academic Excellence Awards are given to high school students who have distinguished themselves in the pursuit of excellence during their high school careers. This year's recipients of the Superintendent Academic Excellence Awards are Chet Powers and Margot Rice. Congratulations to Chet and Margot for their academic achievements, as well as their achievements in sports and community service.

Chet Powers - Chet's guidance counselor, Brian Wanat, describes him as "humble, intelligent, dedicated, and selfless. During the 2013-2014 school year, Chet learned the entire curriculum of the Advanced Placement Computer Science course on his own and earned a 4 out of a possible 5 on the exam. In addition, Chet has thrived within his academic curriculum at BHS, taking 13 Advanced Placement courses and being recognized as an AP scholar with Distinction. He is a member of the National Honor Society and the French National Honor Society. Unless you knew Chet very well you would be unaware of his community service involvement with International Fund of Animal Welfare (IFAW). Chet initially started volunteering to update some of the computer programs. Eventually, he began to install new operating systems and reprogram older computers for the agency to use or sell. Chet's experience and development of the computers was invaluable to the organization. Chet has applied to some of the most distinguished colleges and universities in the country and he is sure to be successful at whichever institution is fortunate enough to have him."

Margot Rice – According to Margot's guidance counselor, Shawn Kingman, her "strong work ethic, superior leadership qualities, and passion for learning and sports are at the top of her graduating class. Margot is a natural born leader and has been elected President of her class for the past three years. By the end of her senior year, Margot will have completed 13 Advanced Placement courses with outstanding success. Margot has been on the school's honor roll every term and is a member of the Latin National Honor Society and National Honor Society here at the high school. She is a three sport varsity athlete and captain in soccer and basketball, and is an Old Colony League All-Star in soccer and basketball. What is most impressive about Margot is that she has never compromised who she is as a person in order to accomplish her goals. Margot is the textbook definition of a hard-working, motivated, and conscientious student who deeply loves sports and competition."

A Note From the Town Collector:

Just a friendly reminder:

√ Fourth Quarter Real Estate and Personal Property Tax bills are due May 1, 2015.

The first commitment of 2015 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills were issued on February 17, 2015 and were due on March 19, 2015. There are several commitments issued each year for the current year and also for prior years. These bills should be paid timely to avoid interest and penalties. If a bill is issued, it does not go away! You must pay the excise or file for an abatement with the Assessor's office if you no longer own the vehicle and should be done by the due date to avoid interest and penalties.

Art Visits Nature at the Halfway House, Sandy Neck Beach!

The Town of Barnstable in partnership with the Cape Cod Art Association is offering day and overnight excursions to the Halfway House at Sandy Neck Beach. In the guiet of Sandy Neck Beach is the Halfway House, a cottage set in the middle of the dunes, marsh and water. Excursions to this special locale provide artists with the opportunity to "unplug" and enjoy the solitude and scenic landscapes as sources for inspiration.

This program is designed for the painter, photographer, musician, writer and other artists who crave the time to create without everyday interruptions. A beach Ranger provides the 3.5 mile transport through the dunes to the Halfway House. In some of the excursions a naturalist is on hand to share knowledge and expertise.

Trips are scheduled for May 1, September 18th and October 16th, 2015. Trips depart late morning and return after sunset. Overnight excursions return the following day at noon time. \$55.00 day/\$75.00 overnight. Proceeds benefit the Halfway House program. Prior participants say time at the halfway house is, "a unique opportunity to see a beautiful and remote part of the Cape. The view from high on the dunes had another worldly and primitive quality that is difficult to encounter these days. We were on the dunes, with hundreds of swallows swarming right above us."
