All dogs need their new tags on as of July 1, 2016. If you have not purchased a new dog license – come on down to the Town Clerk's office, or send your request and check by mail. Remember, beginning August 1, 2016, a new license will cost you more money due to a late fee of \$5.00 on top of the cost of your license. So save your money and take care of this now!

### Barnstable Village – Parade starting at 9:00 AM

The Barnstable-West Barnstable July 4th Parade and Celebration will commence at 9:00 AM at the County
Complex on Railroad Avenue with an 8:30 AM gathering time; proceed down Main Street (Route 6A); left onto

### **Centerville** - Parade starting at 10:00 AM

#### A Seaside Celebration

Presented by Town of Barnstable 4th of July Parade Committee

Hyannis Main Street – A Seaside Celebration is this year's theme for the 18th Annual Hyannis 4th of July Parade, and it surely will be that, as one of Cape Cod's largest parades will once again offer an afternoon of familyfriendly entertainment on Hyannis Main Street for residents and visitors alike. Once again, the parade will take place on July 4th on Main Street, Hyannis at 4pm. The parade route will start at the intersection of Ocean Street and Main Street and then finish at Sea Street. Parade float entrants will be judged and the winners will be awarded ribbons after the parade on the Hyannis Village Green. Immediately following the awards ceremony, the Town of Barnstable Band will perform patriotic songs at the Town Bandstand on the Hyannis Village Green until 6:30pm. After which, the festivities move to Aselton Park where a band will play before the fireworks, which begin at dusk. The fireworks are visible from beaches and locations facing Nantucket Sound. Fan favorites like Pogo Dave, bagpipers Colum Cille and the Yarmouth Minutemen will be on hand alongside local bands Mike Dumas & Platform Soul and Jo & Co who will be rocking along the route. Meaghan Kenney who is organizing the parade for a fifth year is always moved by the community support it receives. "Local businesses like Baxter's Boathouse are the reason that we are able to put on a parade of this scale year after year. They care about showing the best of Hyannis, and helping the Town put on a good show for everyone. It is events like these that bring the community together, and create so much joy and good will." Leading the Parade as Grand Marshals will be longtime Barnstable residents Peter and Judy Scarafile. Both are very involved in the Cape Cod community volunteering for organizations like Big Brothers Big Sisters, the Cape Cod Chamber of Commerce, The Cape Cod Times Needy Fund, and the American Red Cross, and have received many local awards for their service. But perhaps it is their decades long involvement in the Cape Cod Baseball League – America's past time – that make them perfectly suited to lead the largest local celebration of America's birthday. Parade Parking: Parking Ban from 2 PM to 6 PM on Main Street, Hyannis. Main Street and South Street will be closed to motor vehicle traffic. Also all of Main Street; Old Colony Road and Ocean Street from South Street to Main Street will be closed to motor vehicle traffic beginning at 3 PM.

## **News from the Town Collector**

The Town Collector's office would like to wish each and every one of you a happy, healthy, and safe summer.

The FY2017 Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills will be mailed by July 1, 2016. These bills will be processed through a Lockbox service electronically, which will deposit your check and credit your account in a timely manner. The envelope enclosed with your bill will be addressed to the Town of Barnstable, PO Box 742, Reading, MA 01867. If you use your own on-line bill payment system, you should make certain that the address for mailing is changed to read: Town of Barnstable, PO Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 as these on-line checks need to be processed manually in our office. The following is the FY2017 payment schedule:

Check the Town website at <u>www.townofbarnstable.us</u> to explore the option of scheduling your payment on-line. You must register to use it.

If you go to <a href="www.townofbarnstable.us">www.townofbarnstable.us</a> and scroll down a little, you will see "Pay Bills", which you can click on to bring you to "Register or Login" where you will click again. You will come to "What would you like to pay" page, if it is real estate, click on real estate. You must register as this is a new service provider: under please locate your account, enter the LAST NAME ONLY and hit submit...if you scroll down a little, this should bring up a list of properties... find your property and click on view/pay...will bring you to page "Register Now", click and will bring you to registration page and the rest should be easy! PLEASE CALL WITH ANY QUESTIONS 508-862-4054.

# An Update from the Assessing Department:

The month of July brings visitors and warm weather to the Cape but it also begins the period to apply for all the types of tax exemptions for Fiscal Year 2017. The qualification date required by the elderly, blind and veterans exemptions is July 1 of the fiscal year, every year.

Each exemption has its own specific requirements for qualification and the applications and qualification requirements are available on our Assessor's webpage on the Town's website, at the Department of Revenue website or at our front counter. The residential exemption has a different qualifying date of January 1 prior to the fiscal year being applied for. For example, to qualify for the upcoming FY2017 residential exemption, if adopted by the Town Council again, you must first own and occupy your property as of January 1, 2016 and then file the application and documentation on or after July 1, 2016. All exemptions received and qualified by the Board of Assessors by the end of October will be reflected on your actual tax bill, normally issued at the end of December. For all exemptions, you may still apply up to 3 months after the actual tax bill is issued.

The issue that causes the most problems with qualifying for any of these exemptions is missing documentation that supports the application. In the case of the elderly exemption it is usually incomplete income and asset information that requires us to contact the applicant to request the missing information and that delays qualification and sometimes causes denials. So, if applying, be sure to completely read the instructions, fill out the applications and supply copies of the required information prior to submitting it to this office. Also, the blind, elderly and veterans exemptions require a new application every fiscal year while the residential exemption only has to be done once or until the ownership status changes. If you fail to apply within the statutory times outlined above in any one year, the Board of Assessors has no authority to grant the exemption for that year, regardless of otherwise being qualified.

If you have any questions when working with these applications, please call the Assessor's Office at 508-862-4022 and we'll be happy to answer them to ensure that you receive the exemption you're entitled to in a timely manner.

## **Barnstable Airport Announces First ACE-Operations Graduate**



A Barnstable Municipal Airport Operation Specialist has completed Barnstable Municipal Airport's first - Airport Certified Employee "ACE" program.

Will Plitaikis finished the "ACE" program with the American Association of Airport Executives. The program provides comprehensive training and certification for airport operations professionals. The in-depth course covers several different aspects of airfield operations including FAA regulations and reporting, wildlife hazard mitigation, airport design, airfield lighting, navigational aids, safety during construction, communications, winter operations and hazardous materials. At the conclusion of the course, Plikaitis passed a final exam to receive certification based on industry standards.

Plikaitis came to the airport in 2007 with a degree in business administration from Valparaiso University. He has also served as a paramedic in the Towns of Quincy, Weymouth, Brookline, Braintree, Plymouth and West Barnstable; and served as the Director of Advanced Life Support Programs, in the Office of Emergency Service Training at the Downtown Campus of UMass Boston.


