By the time you see this note we will be in full swing selling the Dog Licenses!

You can renew your dog's license by mail by sending to us the following:

- √ a stamped self-address envelope;
- √ include a check for \$7.00 for a spayed or neutered animal;
- √ or \$10.00 for a male or female dog;
- √ a copy of the current rabies certificate (if it has been updated recently); and
- √ please include your email address!



Mail all of the above to: Town Clerk, 367 Main Street, Hyannis, MA 02601.

You may also renew the dog license in person during regular office hours (**Monday through Friday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM**). A photo of Barnstable's Best Dog will be in our June notes since we have not had the voting yet. I want to send out a big thank you to all the dog owners who entered their favorite canine in the contest. It is so much fun to see the great photos of the dogs, and I am so glad all of you choose your favorite dog!

Remember you must have a new tag on your dog by July. Renew your license now to avoid having to pay late fees!!! Remember our dog year runs from July 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30<sup>th</sup>, so the new tags will go on your dog on July 1st.

### SUMMER SEASONAL SERVICE BETWEEN NEW YORK AND HYANNIS BEGINS IN MAY

Travelers flying between New York's JFK Airport and Hyannis, MA on Cape Cod will again have a direct option as JetBlue Airlines begins their seasonal service between the two airports on Thursday, May 12. The popular airline will be offering nonstop flights Thursday through Monday between May 12 and June 16. Daily flights to New York will begin on June 16, aboard a 100-seat Embraer E190 twin-engine jet, an aircraft with a reputation for safety, as well as quiet takeoffs and landings.

## Superintendent's Corner

Maintenance and improvement of capital facilities is not a very exciting subject. Nevertheless, the school department manages nearly one million square feet of space, and it is important to maintain and improve that space for the benefit of those who use the space (including students, staff, and residents) and the taxpayers of Barnstable. Therefore, I am pleased to report that on April 7 the Town Council appropriated funds for five school department capital improvement projects totaling \$5.2 million for Fiscal Year 2017. The projects include:

- *Façade Improvement and Roof Replacement at Barnstable Community Horace Mann Charter Public School (\$4,286,000)*. Continued deterioration of the building exterior causes increasing water and air infiltration, and the failure of mortar joints and poured surfaces allows water penetration. Postponing this project would result in further deterioration, with continued interior water damage and structural damage to masonry walls.
- *Parking Lot Light Pole Replacement and Restroom Fixture and Hardware Upgrades at Barnstable United Elementary School (\$475,000)*. Existing fiberglass parking lot light poles are failing at the connection point between the base sleeve and the pole and present a safety hazard. Existing restroom plumbing and fixtures are over 20 years old and are obsolete. Replacement parts are increasingly hard to find. Postponing the restroom upgrades would result in continuing problems with leaks and non-operational fixtures with a potential for health and safety issues.
- *District-Wide Unit Ventilator Upgrades (\$250,000)*. The unit ventilators in our elementary schools are over 50 years old. They are failing and do not operate to current air quality standards. This is the first year of a five-year plan to replace unit ventilators in all five elementary schools.
- *Pump Flange Replacement at Barnstable High School (\$70,000)*. Existing circulating pump flanges at BHS have well exceeded their life expectancy and have begun to fail. This project will replace and upgrade existing rubber pump coupler assemblies with stainless steel replacement units. Postponing the upgrades would affect reliable heating and cooling at BHS.
- *Walk-in Cooler Replacements at Barnstable High School and Hyannis West Elementary School (\$120,000)*. Existing walk-in coolers at BHS and Hyannis West have reached the end of their life expectancy and present both reliability and efficiency issues. Postponing replacement of these coolers would result in continued expense for repairs to operate obsolete equipment and replace spoiled food.

### A note from the Town Collector's office:

Just a friendly reminder:

- ✓ Fourth Quarter Real Estate and Personal Property Tax bills are due **May 2, 2016.**

The first commitment of Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills was issued on February 24, 2016 and was due on March 25, 2016. There are several commitments issued each year for the current year and also for prior years. These bills should be paid timely to avoid interest and penalties. If a bill is issued, it does not go away! You must pay the excise or file for an abatement with the Assessor's office if you no longer own the vehicle and should be done by the due date to avoid interest and penalties.

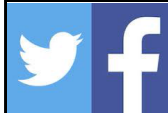

### **2016 Parking Permits/Beach Stickers Walk-In Purchases**

Barnstable Recreation is pleased to announce that 2016 Parking Permits will be available to purchase in person beginning Monday, May 2, 2016 at the Hyannis Youth and Community Center, 141 Bassett Lane, Hyannis, MA 02601.



#### **Hours of Operation:**

**Monday through Saturday – 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.**

**Sundays and Holidays – 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.**

#### **Required documents:**

A copy of the current registration for each vehicle requesting a permit.

- A.** If your registration(s) does not reflect a Barnstable address and you are a Barnstable taxpayer, we have the software available to research and confirm taxpayer status.
- B.** If your registration(s) reflects a leased vehicle, please bring in a copy of each registration and a copy of the page from your lease agreement showing your name on the agreement.
- C.** If your vehicle is leased or registered to the business you own or work for, please bring in a copy of each registration and a copy of the lease agreement as well as any document that links you to the business (business card, letterhead, etc.)

#### **Types of permits and fees:**

**Resident:** \$40 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and resident). Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Landlord:** \$300 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and resident). Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Seasonal:** \$250 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to **public beaches only**.

**Weekly:** \$70 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into **public beaches only**.

**Replacement:** \$5. This permit is offered at a reduced rate should you sell your vehicle or install a new windshield **after** purchasing your initial permit. You must present your original permit to receive the reduced rate.

**Handicap:** \$15 per permit (limit of two per household). Available to resident and/or taxpayer handicap individuals who have a valid driver's license and own a vehicle registered in their name.
