TOWN CLERK REMINDERS FOR OCTOBER...

It is never too late to get your beagle legal! We still have many dog owners in town who have not registered their dog for this year. Please do so immediately in order to avoid a possible additional fine.



To register your dog, please send in by mail a copy of the current rabies certificate and a check for \$12.00 (if the animal is spayed or neutered) or \$15.00 (if the animal is not spayed or neutered). Included in this charge is a late fee since all dogs were to be licensed by July 1, 2014

Dogs must be licensed every year. The licensing year runs from July 1-June 30. So take a look at your dog, and if they do not have a Town of Barnstable tag in the shape of a "PAW" you need to register them now.

Also, our State election is scheduled for **Tuesday**, **November 4**, **2014**. All polling places will be open during the normal voting hours of 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

The last day to register to vote for this election is Wednesday, October 15, 2014. The Town Clerk's office will be open with Registrars on hand until 8:00 p.m. If you are already registered you do not need to re-register ; however, if you have moved or recently re-located please call our office to confirm your current registration (508-862-4044).

If you did not receive a census form the beginning of the year, we recommend confirming your voter registration prior to October 15, 2014. We can do our best to correct your residential and mailing addresses so that you will have no problems at the polls.

Town of Barnstable Assessing Department

The Assessing staff is finalizing valuations for FY2015, in preparation for the tax rate hearings in November. Real estate market valuations are recovering slowly from the recent fiscal crises but are definitely strengthening. Some taxpayers will see the impact of that recovering market on their valuations for FY2015.

If you have not yet filed an application for an exemption you are qualified for, time is running out to see them on your tax bill. Applications must be submitted and successfully processed by the beginning of November to be posted to your actual tax bill. You may still submit applications through the end of next March but will have that reduction posted to the remaining balance of your tax bill instead. If you have already qualified for the residential exemption in a prior year, you do not need to file again and this is the only exemption that does not require annual filings with our office. We encourage you to review your tax bill or property record on-line in January after the actual tax bills are issued to ensure you have received any exemptions you are qualified for. If you have not been property credited, you have until the end of March to file an application or abatement request with the Board of Assessors. State law does not allow the Board of Assessors to act on any issue that is not brought to its attention in writing within the statutory time limits each year. Please call our office at 508-862-4022 if you need further explanation or guidance on these or any other issues.

The Truck 95 Experiment

As you can imagine, the vehicles we use to accomplish our work are expensive. These are necessary tools to do our job, but we are always looking for ways to stretch the Town's resources. This winter we will be conducting an experiment that may do just that. A new triaxel dump truck, which the department uses for heavy construction and as part of our snow and ice removal fleet can cost close to \$200,000.

The experiment is to utilize a surplus Army vehicle we own this winter, to see if it can perform the same functions, and be as reliable, as the "civilian model". We had our truck painted to match the rest of our fleet, made a plow frame for it, installed a better seat for our operators, and retrofitted the electrical system to support our communication radios. All told the Department invested approximately \$10,000 into this vehicle (including its acquisition costs). Before and after pictures of "Truck 95" are below. It will be interesting to see if it can take the pounding, if the maintenance costs are reasonable, and if we can get parts in a

timely manner. If it works, it could be a real savings for the Town. So this winter, if you see a big red Army truck going down the street, you will know it is Truck 95 trying to make the "DPW team."

STATEMENT BY AIRPORT MANAGER ROLAND 'BUD' BREAULT

As the seasonal jetBlue air service between Barnstable Airport and New York-JFK comes to a temporary close, it's time to applaud its extraordinary success. In eleven weeks, between June 26th and September 7th, more than 12,000 passengers used the once-a-day service in both directions. On average, flights on the airline's 100-seat Embraer twin-engine jets were 85 percent full.

The results confirm our belief that there is great potential for expanded air service from Hyannis to points beyond Boston and the nearby islands, jetBlue recognized that promise and responded with superb service that drew customers in numbers beyond our original expectations. It was all about convenience, speed and quality.

There's no doubt that jetBlue's New York service enhanced a successful summer season on Cape Cod and helped lift the Cape's overall economy.

Looking ahead, we have invited jetBlue to return in 2015 with service that begins earlier in the calendar year and extends into the fall season. We are reaching out to other regional air carriers, urging them to learn from jetBlue's success and establish new air service between Cape Cod and more distant destinations.



A Note From the Town Collector:

Where did the summer go? This is the question we are asking in the Town Collector's office and I am sure many of you are asking the same question.

It has been a very busy year for myself and my staff and we are rapidly approaching the due date of the real estate and personal property tax bills for the second quarter of FY2015, which will be due on November 3, 2014 PLEASE NOTE: you should have the coupon that indicates the amount due for the November remit, which was mailed in the three part bill back on July 1, 2014. If you have any questions, please call our office at **508** -**862-4054**. This is the taxpayer's responsibility! We have been on a quarterly billing system since FY06 and many taxpayers are still confused. If you have a question, it is best to call upon one of the staff members at the office than not to call as a delay in payment can be more expensive for the taxpayer. A schedule of payments is included in your mailing of the tax bills: :

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2015 Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2014

- ✓ First Quarter due August 1, 2014
- ✓ Second Quarter due November 3, 2014

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2014

- ✓ Third Quarter due February 2, 2015
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due May 1**, 2015

Any change in ownership, mailing address or anything that needs to be changed on your bill should be addressed immediately with the Assessor's office. The amount of returned mail for various reasons is incredible and we do our best to try to find the correct destination, but the staff does not have a lot of time to devote to this issue. There are several billings that go out for motor vehicles and sewer rental that need to be posted along with the normal duties, leaving very little time to do "catch up". We try our best to accommodate taxpayers with our limited staff.

TIME TO RENEW YOUR BURGLAR ALARM REGISTRATION WITH THE BARNSTABLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

All burglar alarm registrations within the Town of Barnstable will expire on **December 31, 2014.** If you are an Alarm User, commercial or residential, monitored or non-monitored, you need to renew your Alarm Registration and get your 2015/2016 decal. Please complete a 2015/2016 Alarm Registration renewal form and submit with a \$25.00 registration fee. Renewal forms are available at the Barnstable Police Department or online at <u>www.barnstablepolice.com</u>. Please renew by the expiration date (12/31/2014) to avoid costly late fees and unregistered alarm fines. If you have any questions regarding the renewal please call 508-778-3824. Tips to Becoming a Better Consumer

October's Tip...Home Heating Oil Deliveries.

As the winter starts to draw closer, weights & measures inspectors throughout the state begin their annual inspections of home heating oil truck meters. Each year oil truck meters are tested and sealed to ensure compliance. The home heating oil is delivered into the appropriate test measure, the result is recorded and if within tolerance the meter is then sealed with a current security wire. The security seal will prevent tampering of the meter calibration unit as well as the other meter components. As part of the test, a delivery ticket is inserted into the printer to check for information that MUST be provided for the consumer to see at the time of delivery.

The delivery ticket shall provide the following information:

- Serial number of the ticket
 - Name and address of the buyer and seller
 - Date of delivery
 - Person making the delivery
 - Amount and type of fuel delivered
 - Price per gallon

Things to look for...

- When the delivery has been made to your home, confirm that you received the delivery with a ticket that includes all information listed above.
- If you participate in a "lock-in" price program, be sure that when your statement arrives the quantity charged is what was delivered and the agreed upon price is charged.
- Contact the local weights & measures department with any concerns regarding the delivery of home heating oil deliveries.
- If you do issue a consumer complaint, do so immediately with as much information for the inspector as possible.

QUICK FACT: In 2013, the Town of Barnstable tested and sealed 124 Vehicle Tank Meters in 10 towns on Cape Cod. Of the 124 meters tested, 13 needed adjusting; this resulted in saving both the consumers and merchants \$35,454.13.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the performance of a commercial weighing or measuring device used for trade, bring it to the attention of the merchant. If the problem is not resolved, contact the local Weights & Measures office for advice and/or assistance. The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes; Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Chatham, Dennis, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.


