TOWN CLERK REMINDERS FOR OCTOBER...

We still have many dog-owners in town who have not registered their dog for this year. Please do so immediately. To register your dog, please send in by mail a copy of the current rabies certificate and a check for \$12.00 (if the animal is spayed or neutered) or \$15.00 (if the animal is not spayed or neutered). Included in this charge is a late fee since all dogs were to be licensed by July 1, 2015. Put in the envelope a stamped self-addressed envelope and we will send out the tag in the return mail.

Also, our local election in all precincts is scheduled for **Tuesday, November 3, 2015**. All the polling places will be open during the normal voting hours of 7 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Last day to register to vote for this election is **Wednesday, October 14, 2015**. The Town Clerk's office will be open with Registrars on hand until 8 p.m. If you are already registered you do not need to re-register – but if you have moved or recently re-located please call our office to confirm your current registration (508) 862-4044.

Superintendent's Corner

Welcome back to the 2015-2016 school year. On Wednesday, September 2, we welcomed back approximately 5,200 students to the Barnstable Public Schools. It was a smooth opening to the new school year. After a summer to recharge, students and staff were excited to return to a classroom environment.

Thank you to the Barnstable school custodians and maintenance staff for the cleanliness of our schools and classrooms, as well as the manicured school grounds. An enormous amount of cleaning and maintenance goes on while school buildings are (relatively) empty during summer months. I appreciate the work of our Facilities Director, David Kanyock, in supervising and coordinating all of our summer capital projects.

On September 2 we also opened the new Enoch Cobb Early Learning Center, which houses the Barnstable integrated preschool program. This program serves children with disabilities between ages three and five and their peers. With the opening of the Early Learning Center, the integrated preschool program now has a permanent home after several years of moving from one location to another.

Thanks to all of our employees for your continued efforts to move our schools forward. With our partners at the National Center for Learning Disabilities, we will continue this year to implement the Massachusetts Tier System of Supports (MTSS) throughout the district. This blueprint for a single integrated, tiered system of supports responsive to the academic and non-academic needs of all students will help us improve our practice and improve student achievement.

Other priorities this year for me as interim superintendent include establishing a working group with wide representation to analyze student performance and other data and develop a district improvement plan and creating a long-range plan for the use and possible renovations of our school buildings and fields, taking into account potential changes in student enrollment.

Another district priority is the search for a new permanent superintendent of schools. The School Committee has appointed a search committee comprised of parents, teachers, administrators, community representatives, and Town Council and School Committee representatives to recommend candidates to the School Committee, and the search committee has begun work. I'm confident that there will be no shortage of candidates well qualified to lead the Barnstable Public Schools into the future.

A note from the Town Collector's office:

Where did the summer go? This is the question we are asking in the Town Collector's office and I am sure many of you are asking the same question.

It has been a very busy year for myself and my staff and we are rapidly approaching the due date of the real estate and personal property tax bills for the second quarter of FY2016, which will be due on November 2nd. PLEASE NOTE: you should have the coupon that indicates the amount due for the November remit, which was mailed in the three part bill back on July 1, 2015. If you have any questions, please call our office at **(508) 862-4054**. This is the taxpayers responsibility. We have been on a quarterly billing system since FY06 and many taxpayers are still confused. If you have a question, it is best to call upon one of the staff members at the office than not to call as a delay in payment can be more expensive for the taxpayer. Once again, a schedule of payments is included in your mailing of the tax bills as a reminder, which was:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2016

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2015

- ✓ First Quarter **due August 3, 2015**
- ✓ Second Quarter **due November 2, 2015**

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2015

- ✓ Third Quarter **due February 1, 2016**
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due May 2, 2016**

Any change in ownership, mailing address or anything that needs to be changed on your bill should be addressed immediately with the Assessor's office. The amount of returned mail for various reasons is incredible. We do our best to try to find the correct destination. There are several billings that go out for motor vehicles and sewer rental that need to be posted along with our normal duties. We respectfully request your assistance in helping us to help you by providing us with any updates to your mailing address.

Composition of the Water Resource Advisory Committee: *New*****

The Water Resources Advisory Committee ("WRAC") must consist of eleven (11) members as follows:

- Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Town Council so as to be as geographically diverse as possible so as to represent all the salt water embayments, freshwater lakes and ponds and watersheds of the Town of Barnstable.
- Three (3) members shall be appointed by the Town Council as at large members who have interest or expertise in matters related to water quality and wastewater issues.
- Three (3) members shall be Town Councilors, appointed by the Town Council President. Town Council members shall be full voting members of WRAC and shall act as liaisons from WRAC to the Town Council and Town Manager.

From the Marine & Environmental Affairs and Harbormaster Office:

The pumpout boats' season will end on October 12th. Please give advance notice for pumpout requests. The shore side pumpout at Bismore Park Marina and Barnstable Harbor Marina will be closing for the season on October 28th. As the 2015 boating season winds down, the pumpout boats will be running on an abbreviated schedule, Friday – Tuesday; weather permitting. Please plan ahead to have your boat pumped prior to hauling out for the season.

You may continue to schedule pumpouts using the email address pumpout@town.barnstable.ma.us or call the Harbormaster's office at (508) 790-6273. It is best to schedule pumpouts in advanced. The boats can be easily identified, both boats are white center console vessels with the lettering "HARBORMASTER" on both sides.

The pumpout boats monitor VHF channels 16 and 09 during operating hours.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Hurricane season goes until November 30, 2015. According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

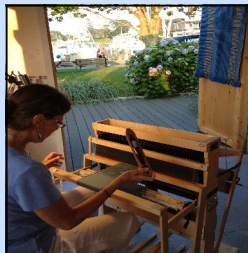
