### From the Town Manager

The Department of Public Works prepared for this year's winter weather by creating a protocol that they have communicated throughout the Town and was put into use during Winter Storm Jonus which arrived on Saturday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>. The DPW team's efforts along with increased communication provided an opportunity to see the protocol in action. The new Snow and Ice brochure was included in the Town Clerk's Census mailing as well as outreach through other methods. If you don't have a copy yet, you can visit any of our Town buildings to pick up a copy.

We kicked off the formal budget preparation process with a presentation on the financial condition of the town at a joint meeting of the Town Council and School Committee on January 21<sup>st</sup>. This was also an opportunity for Finance Director Mark Milne to publicly unveil Open Budget. The Commonwealth has awarded Barnstable a \$5,000 grant under our Community Compact Open Budget Best Practice. The finance department has been developing the web-based open budget with the firm of Socrata. The grant will be used to off-set development costs of producing the Open Budget web-site. This is the first grant we have received under our Community Compact agreement with the Commonwealth. The winter months are when town staff prepares the Capital Budget and the Operating Budget for presentation to the Town Council in March and May, respectively.

Barnstable has received the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award. The award demonstrates the commitment of the Town's governing body and staff to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. Both Finance Director Mark Milne and I received a Certificate of Recognition for Budget Presentation for being the individuals designated as primarily responsible for Barnstable having achieved the award. I am proud of our budget team and finance department for getting this national recognition.

The Town of Barnstable was recognized with an award certificate for placing among the top three municipalities in Category 1 of the Massachusetts Municipal Association's (MMA) Annual Town Report contest. The MMA believes, as do we, that Town Reports serve to communicate important information to town residents, and promote an understanding of and involvement in local government. I want to thank staff in the Town Manager's office: Shirlee Oakley, Sarah Colvin, and Linda Wheelden who work so hard to prepare this report. The award certificate was presented Saturday, January 23, 2016, at the President's Reception and Awards Ceremony as part of the MMA's 2016 Annual Meeting.

We will soon be welcoming Meg Mayo-Brown as our new Superintendent. Ms. Mayo-Brown was selected by the School Committee to replace Interim Superintendent Bill Butler. While Ms. Mayo-Brown officially begins in July, she will be working with Atty. Butler during the creation of the FY2017 budget.

### February Town Clerk Reminders :

The Town Clerk's Office is working diligently to input the data from all of your Census forms!

When you receive your census form please look it over, make any changes necessary and send it back to this office. You can mail it or drop it off in our office. Even if there are no changes we need you to sign the form and send it back to us. This will make your voting easier this year and keep you up to date on the Voter Registration System.

This form must be completed by all residents (not just citizens or voters) all people residing in the Town of Barnstable. This is in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Hopefully you read the insert from the DPW on the new Snow and Ice Standards of Service which will give you an outline of what to expect and contact information during a winter storm.

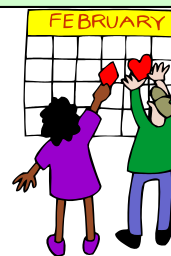
You can't register to vote on the form. If you wish to register to vote or make any other changes to your voter status, you can register on line at [www.sec.state.ma.us](http://www.sec.state.ma.us), or pick up a mail in form at any of our local libraries or at the Town Clerk's Office. Any changes to your voter status must be completed by February 10<sup>th</sup> for the March 1<sup>st</sup> Presidential Primary Election.

If you are going to be out of town on March 1<sup>st</sup> or you are unable to go to the polls due to sickness, please come see us in the office or send us a request in the mail for an absentee ballot.

On March 1<sup>st</sup> all the polling locations will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM. Remember your vote is your voice!

## Superintendent's Corner

Last September, the Barnstable Public Schools opened the Enoch Cobb Early Learning Center (ECELC) to house the district's integrated preschool program. The ECELC is a permanent modular building and is the first phase of a three-phase modular construction project.

Phase 2 of the project is the addition of a 5,000 square foot modular building at Barnstable-West Barnstable (BWB) Elementary School. The addition will house two classrooms, an art/music classroom, a media center, a conference room, and restrooms and storage. Phase 3 is the addition of a 6,000 square foot modular building at Hyannis West Elementary School to house four classrooms, offices, a conference room, and restrooms.

I'm pleased to report that Phases 2 and 3 are now underway. With the assistance of TBA Architects, Inc., a contract for construction of Phases 2 and 3 has been awarded to Vanguard Modular Building Systems, LLC. A groundbreaking for both phases took place at BWB on January 19. We expect that both phases will be completed and the space ready for occupancy by the start of the 2016-2017 school year.

With the completion of this modular construction project, we will have removed all of the portable classrooms in Barnstable, some of which have been in place for several decades. Unlike portable classrooms, modular classroom buildings are permanent structures located on permanent foundations. They are similar to conventionally-constructed buildings but offer the advantages of efficiency and quality control that come from the fact that much of the construction takes place in a factory setting rather than at the construction site.

I would like to give special thanks to the School Committee, the Town Council, Town Manager Tom Lynch, and Finance Director Mark Milne for their support for this project. Also deserving of thanks are Director of Facilities Dave Kanyock, Deputy Finance Director Gareth Markwell, Hyannis West Principal Kathi Amato, and former BWB Principal Frank Gigliotti and current BWB Principal Karen Cloutier for their time, effort, and input on the project.

With the completion of Phases 2 and 3 of this project, the Town of Barnstable will have accomplished important educational goals. Our integrated preschool program now has a permanent home after years of moving around to various locations. The modular additions to BWB and Hyannis West will help meet our space needs for many years. Just as significantly, the additions will allow those schools to return space now used for classes to its intended purposes, which will allow the schools to provide or expand programs designed to enrich the lives of their students.

This is a project in which the entire community should take pride.

## News You Can Use

### A note from the Town Collector's office:

The FY2016 Actual Real Estate bill for the third quarter is due on February 1, 2016.

### Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2016

**Preliminary** Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2015

- ✓ First Quarter were due August 3, 2015
- ✓ Second Quarter were due November 2, 2015

**Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2015**

- ✓ Third Quarter **due** February 1, 2016
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due** May 2, 2016

The 2016 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills should be ready to be issued this month. This is the largest commitment issued by the Registry of Motor Vehicles. There are several commitments issued throughout the year. Please do not ignore these bills! If you sold or no longer own the vehicle, you must contact the Assessor's office for filing of an abatement. Unpaid Motor Vehicle Excise bills do not go away! Interest and penalties for unpaid bills add additional monies to the base charge of the bill and can "flag" your license at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

Any request for information regarding amount of monies paid for real estate, personal property and motor vehicle excise taxes for income tax filings must be made in writing to our office. We do not give the information out by telephone due to the number of telephone calls received as we would not get our day to day responsibilities done.

### Friendly Reminder from the Town of Barnstable's Five Fire Districts:

Candles may be pretty to look at but they are a cause of home fires — and home fire deaths. Remember, a candle is an open flame, which means that it can easily ignite anything that can burn.

#### **CANDLE WITH CARE**

- ◆ Blow out all candles when you leave the room or go to bed.
- ◆ Avoid the use of candles in the bedroom and other areas where people may fall asleep.
- ◆ Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that can burn.

#### **IF YOU DO BURN CANDLES, MAKE SURE THAT YOU...**

- ◆ Use candle holders that are sturdy, and won't tip over easily.
- ◆ Put candle holders on a sturdy, uncluttered surface.
- ◆ Light candles carefully. Keep your hair and any loose clothing away from the flame.
- ◆ Don't burn a candle all the way down — put it out before it gets too close to the holder or container.
- ◆ Never use a candle if oxygen is used in the home.
- ◆ Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage.

### **2016 Parking Permits/Beach Stickers**

We are pleased to announce that 2016 Parking Permits are now available through our mail-in process. For those of you that supplied Barnstable Recreation with your e-mail address, you should be receiving your application via e-mail. If you do not receive it, or did not supply an e-mail address, applications may be downloaded from our website at [www.town.barnstable.ma.us](http://www.town.barnstable.ma.us) under the Recreation Division link. In order to reduce our postage costs, we will not be sending out applications via the postal system. If you do not have access to a printer and need an application mailed to you, please feel free to submit your request in writing to:

#### **Types of permits and fees:**

**Resident:** \$40 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Landlord:** \$300 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Seasonal:** \$250 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to **public beaches only**.

**Weekly:** \$70 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into **public beaches only**.

**Replacement:** \$5. This permit is offered at a reduced rate should you sell your vehicle or install a new windshield **after** purchasing your initial permit. You must present your original permit to receive the reduced rate.

**Handicap:** \$15 per permit (limit of two per household). Available to resident and/or taxpayer handicap individuals who have a valid driver's license and own a vehicle registered in **their** name.

Art Visits Nature at the Halfway House, Sandy Neck Beach! The Town of Barnstable in partnership with the Cape Cod Art Association is offering day and overnight excursions for artists to the Halfway House at Sandy Neck Beach. In the quiet of Sandy Neck Beach is the Halfway House, a cottage set in the middle of the dunes, marsh and water. Excursions to this special locale provide artists with the opportunity to "unplug" and enjoy the solitude and scenic landscapes as sources for inspiration.
