Happy New Year from the Town Clerk's office...

We hope you and yours have a wonderful New Year and may this year bring you good health and much happiness.



A few weeks ago, we sent out reminder letters. These communications were specifically to those of you that may have forgotten...you need to register your dogs. All dogs in the Town of Barnstable must be registered by the time they are six (6) months old. We receive notification from veterinarians when your dogs receive their rabies shot which prompts us to send out reminders. By the time you receive this bulletin the late fee for dog licensing will be ten dollars (\$10.00) per dog.

Some of you may be receiving a mailing from the Town Clerk's Office in the form of a postcard. In accordance with Massachusetts General Law Chapter 51 Section 37A, we have deleted many voters from the rolls. We do this when we have not heard from you in many years via the Annual Census; or if you have not voted in the last two federal elections. This helps us maintain a current voting list.

Hopefully, by the beginning of February, we will begin the major project of our Census/Voter Registration forms going out to each household. By responding to the census, you are providing proof of your residency to protect your voting rights. If all the information on your census is correct, simply sign the bottom of the census and send it back to us.

Also, if someone has moved out of your household and is a voter – please give us their address, email or phone number so that we may contact them and get verification. We cannot remove a voter without their verification; thus many people stay on the census for four (4) years until we can, by law, remove them. If anyone has been added to your household, just put their information down on one of the blank lines. Make any and all corrections on the form.

You cannot register to vote on the census form. You need to pick up a voter registration form at your local library and fill it out and send it in – or come in to the Clerk's office.

For those residents that live here part time here in Barnstable, and part of the time in a warmer climate, you fill out the census form using the following guidelines:

You are a Town of Barnstable resident if :

This is your permanent address


This is where are you registered to vote

Superintendent's Corner

Happy New Year!

Whether it's the start of a new school year or the start of a new calendar year, beginnings are filled with hope and excitement of what's to come. After a wonderful holiday break, we are hopeful and excited about the beginning of a new year and we have several areas of focus that I'd like to share with you.

Early Learning Center Groundbreaking

In the fall of 2014, we had a bid and re-bid for the new modular Early Learning Center project. Costs came in slightly higher than the \$2 million estimate. The Town Council voted to approve additional funds for the Early Learning Center in December 2014. There will be a groundbreaking ceremony on the project in January 2015. In early 2015, a discussion on the naming of the new Early Learning Center will be a focus of the School Committee. By the start of the 2015-2016 school year, Barnstable Public Schools will have a new modular Early Learning Center for all our Pre-K students to call their own.

Search Committee for a new Principal at BWB

Frank Gigliotti, Principal at BWB, has submitted his letter of intent to retire effective June 30, 2015. Frank has been in education for 35 years, with the last 15 years as Principal of BWB. He has done a wonderful job and will be missed by the school community. As we move to fill this position, the search committee will be comprised of the Director of Human Resources, parents, teachers, an elementary school principal, and a School Committee member.

Budget Process FY '16

The budget process for FY '16 began in 2014 with the Town Manager and me agreeing to continue the 60/40 revenue-sharing agreement, the School Committees goals and priorities, and the cost center submissions. In January 2015, the funding submissions will be reviewed and the School Committee and Town Council will have a joint workshop on the financial forecast. The initial budget presentation to the School Committee will be in February with a public hearing on the budget in March. In April, the School Committee will vote on the budget and the operating budget will be submitted to the Town Manager. In June, there will be a first reading of the budget to the Town Council along with a public hearing and CFAC review, and finally the budget will be adopted.

New PARCC Test

Last spring, Barnstable Public Schools piloted the new PARCC assessment with 4 ELA and 4 Algebra I classes at BHS and 2 ELA and 2 Math classes at each grade level at BIS and BUE. This spring, all students in grades 3-8 will participate in the performance-based assessment in ELA and Math in March. In May, the students will take the end of the year PARCC assessment in ELA and Math. To prepare the students for these assessments, we are focusing on text complexity, that is the types of books the students are reading, and the standards for mathematical practice. Massachusetts has adopted this "test drive" of the PARCC assessment to compare MCAS and PARCC to determine if the state will replace MCAS with the PARCC assessment. The Massachusetts Board of Education will vote in the fall of 2015 whether to adopt PARCC or not as the state's next assessment system.

Results of the District Review

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education performed a District Review in Barnstable the week of November 10, 2014. The Review Team visited 67 classrooms and conducted 22 meetings over their four days with the district. Their report indicating where the District's strengths are and what challenges we face is due in early 2015. I will share the findings with the School Committee and the Barnstable Community when I receive the report.

Grade 7 iPad Mobile Learning Project

In early October 2014, 400 iPads were distributed to the 7th graders at BIS with the goal of enhancing and accelerating learning while leveraging technology and promoting collaboration and creation to increase student engagement. Later this spring, we will survey students and staff to gather their feedback on this project. The information gathered from these surveys coupled with outside evaluation groups will give us a better picture of the impact on learning the iPads have on Barnstable 7th graders.



As we begin this new year, Barnstable Public Schools has several exciting projects to focus on: the Early Learning Center, PARCC assessments, District Review results, the budget process, and iPad learning for grade 7. We wish the best of luck to Mr. Gigliotti and the search committee that has the difficult task of finding his replacement at BWB. The start of 2015 has us filled with hope and excitement!

27th Annual Coastsweep Beach Cleaning



Barnstable Association for Recreational Shellfishing at Scudder's Lane Town Landing

A world wide campaign to remove litter and debris from shorelines received help from local groups and organizations. The 27th annual Coastsweep beach cleanups commenced on September 20, 2014. Volunteers combed the beaches, town landings, and ways-to-water of Barnstable, making them safer for people and marine animals. Cigarette butts, cans, bottles, straws, wrappers, fishing line, and myriad other trash were collected and properly disposed of.

A note from the Town Collector's office:

Happy 2015! We hope it is a happy, healthy and prosperous year for all.

The FY2015 Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were mailed December 31, 2014. The three part billing has the remittance coupon for February 2nd and the remittance coupon for May 1st and a Taxpayer's copy.

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2015:

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed July 1, 2014

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2014
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 3, 2014

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2014

- ✓ Third Quarter **due** February 2, 2015
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due** May 1, 2015

Please check this bill very carefully as this is the **actual** tax bill that reflects any change in the tax rates, assessment, betterment/lien and exemptions. If you have any questions regarding the assessment of the property, you should contact the Assessor's office at 508-862-4022 immediately.

A few tips: If you use your own online bill payment system, please take a moment to make sure you have the correct information in the system. **Check should be made payable to: Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601-0040** and NOT the Lockbox Service, which is the address on the return envelope enclosed with your bill. The Lockbox Service processes the payments electronically for us and without an encoded payment coupon, your own online check can not be processed this way. Your check needs to be processed manually. You should always **use the parcel id# as the identifying account number for real estate** as this number does not change each year. If the check is addressed to the Lockbox, it is rejected and mailed back to our office, which causes a delay in the posting of your payment and makes your payment late.

Check the Town website at: www.town.barnstable.ma.us to explore the option of scheduling your payment online. If you pay with a checking/savings account, the fee is 40 cents. If you use a debit/credit card, there is a percentage based fee of 2.95% of the amount being paid. These fees are not collected by the Town of Barnstable. If you need any assistance with registering to use the online bill payment system, please feel free to contact my office at 508-862-4054.

An Assessing Department Notice:

The FY2015 actual tax bills were mailed **December 31, 2014**. The filing period for abatement requests runs from **Jan. 2** thru **Feb. 2, 2015** at **4:30 P.M.** and abatement requests must be clocked in at the assessing office by the end of that period, no exceptions.

The FY2015 residential valuations are based upon sales that occurred in the calendar year of 2013 only and abatement requests based on market must be supported by valid sales of similar properties from 2013 only. Foreclosure, bank & short sales **ARE NOT** valid market sales and will not be considered as comparables for abatement requests by the Board of Assessors. Commercial, industrial & vacant land values were set from sales from 1/1/2012 thru 12/13/2013 due to lack of sufficient sales in 2013 alone. Sales that occurred during 2014 will be used to establish the FY2016 values and are not admissible for FY15 abatements.

The Board of Assessors will have 90 days from the date each abatement is filed to make a decision. Also, if you are qualified to receive an exemption of any type but haven't filed yet, you still have 90 days from December 31, 2014 to file for the exemption for FY15. 2015 Parking Permits/Beach Stickers

We are pleased to announce that 2015 Parking Permits are now available through our mail-in process. For those of you that supplied Barnstable Recreation with your e-mail address, you should be receiving your application via e-mail. If you do not receive it, or did not supply an e-mail address, applications may be downloaded from our website at www.town.barnstable.ma.us under the Recreation Division link. In order to reduce our postage costs, we will not be sending out applications via the postal system. If you do not have access to a printer and need an application mailed to you, please feel free to submit your request in writing to:

Please include a self-addressed stamped envelope so we can mail the application to you.

Types of permits and fees:

Resident: \$35 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Landlord: \$275 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Seasonal: \$200 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to **public beaches only**.

Weekly: \$50 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into **public beaches only**.

Replacement: \$5. This permit is offered at a reduced rate should you sell your vehicle or install a new windshield **after** purchasing your initial permit.

You must present your original permit to receive the reduced rate.

Handicap: \$10 per permit (limit of two per household). Available to resident and/or taxpayer handicap individuals who have a valid driver's license and own a vehicle registered in **their** name.
