We firmly believe that all elections are important! Part of the election process is your completion of the census/voter confirmation form that goes out in January. This is a mandate by the State and Federal governments that you confirm you are still at the same location. If you do not return the census, or did not receive one, you are made "inactive". Again, that is a requirement of the law. You can still vote, but will be required to fill out an affirmation of continuous residence form when you vote. If you have any questions regarding your voter status do not hesitate to call us on 508-862-4044.

We have an aggressive election schedule in 2016. So please return those Census forms when you receive them in January and avoid additional time spent filling out forms. The following is our election schedule for 2016, please come out and cast your ballot:

- **On March 1st -Presidential Preference Election**
- **In September (no date yet) the State Primary Election**
- **On November 8th State Election**

Superintendent's Corner

In last November's Barnstable Bulletin, former Superintendent Mary Czajkowski reported on the start of a conversation between the Barnstable and Falmouth superintendents about a later start time for high school students. That conversation led to the formation of the Healthy Youth Task Force at Barnstable High School. The task force—which consisted of concerned parents, staff, medical professionals and community members—met regularly to examine the issue of school start time, inviting both school employees and outside experts to share their perspectives about such considerations as child care, family life, employment, finances and co-curricular opportunities. In October the task force made a presentation to the School Committee and formally recommended a later school start time for the 2016-2017 school year.

I believe there is overwhelming evidence that a later start time for high school students is beneficial both in terms of student health and achievement and cost savings over time for the schools and the community. At the same time, I recognize that a change in the high school start time would have implications beyond the high school and would impact student transportation and athletics as well as start times for students in other schools in the district and attendant childcare issues.

In order to thoroughly examine all these issues, I have recommended that the School Committee appoint an advisory committee comprised of two School Committee members along with parents, teachers and administrators at the high school, intermediate school and elementary school levels, the athletic director, a central office administrator and a high school student to look at this issue and report back to the School Committee. The advisory committee will look at the benefits and costs of a change in the high school start time from the perspectives of stakeholders across the district.

I look forward to working with the advisory committee, and I hope that a broad and inclusive process will result in a community consensus on this important issue. I expect the advisory committee to offer multiple opportunities for community input, and I urge you to participate in the process.

Composition of the Water Resource Advisory Committee: *New*****

The Water Resources Advisory Committee ("WRAC") must consist of eleven (11) members as follows:

- Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Town Council so as to be as geographically diverse as possible so as to represent all the salt water embayments, freshwater lakes and ponds and watersheds of the Town of Barnstable.
- Three (3) members shall be appointed by the Town Council as at large members who have interest or expertise in matters related to water quality and wastewater issues.
- Three (3) members shall be Town Councilors, appointed by the Town Council President. Town Council members shall be full voting members of WRAC and shall act as liaisons from WRAC to the Town Council and Town Manager.

An Update from the Assessing Department:

The Assessing staff is finalizing valuations for FY2016, in preparation for the tax rate hearings in November. Real estate market valuations have regained ground in both the residential and commercial/industrial properties. Most taxpayers will see the impact of that recovered market on their valuations for FY2016.

If you have not yet filed an application for an exemption you are qualified for, time is running out to see them on your tax bill. Applications must be submitted and successfully processed by the middle of November to be posted to your actual tax bill. You may still submit applications through the end of March but will have that reduction posted to the remaining balance of your tax bill instead. If you have already qualified for the residential exemption in a prior year, you do not need to file again and this is the only exemption that does not require annual filings with our office. We encourage you to review your tax bill or property record on-line in January after the actual tax bills are issued to ensure you have received any exemptions you are qualified for. If you have not been property credited, you have until the end of March to file an application or abatement request with the Board of Assessors. State law does not allow the Board of Assessors to act on any issue that is not brought to its attention in writing within the statutory time limits each year. Please call our office at 508-862-4022 if you need further explanation or guidance on these or any other assessing issues.

From the Harbormaster

The Harbormaster's Office would like to remind all boaters that channel markers will be pulled for the season starting on **November 1**. Also, if your boat/dinghy is stored on Town property, it must be removed by **November 15**. Any vessel that remains after that date will be considered abandoned and removed by Harbormaster Staff.

Snow and Ice - Please Stake Your Property

Hard to believe, but a new snow and ice season is almost upon us, and the DPW is in full preparation mode. Along that vein, this month we have a little quiz for everyone.

Take a look at the two pictures below:



Now, define exactly where the edge of the road is.

Pretty difficult, isn't it? Now add to that challenge by making this determination after working 20+ hours, it being dark in the middle of the night, wind driven snow, and moving at 15 mph. As you can see our drivers face a significant challenge.

One of the biggest items we all can do to help them is stake the edge of our properties with plow stakes/reflectors. Plow stakes can be wood or fiberglass with reflectors on top or wrapped around the body of the stake. The reflective material needs to be high enough up the stake that it can be seen over the snow drift. The stakes should be driven into the ground as close to the edge of the property as possible. Generally we recommend placing them every 8-10 feet. Installing stakes is easier before the ground freezes, so we recommend you do it in November.

Friendly Reminder from the Hyannis Fire Department:

Remember to change your batteries when you change your clocks. Since we are approaching the winter season please take note that all homes should have a working carbon monoxide detector on every floor which is a Massachusetts state law.

Community Development Block Grant Funds Now Available

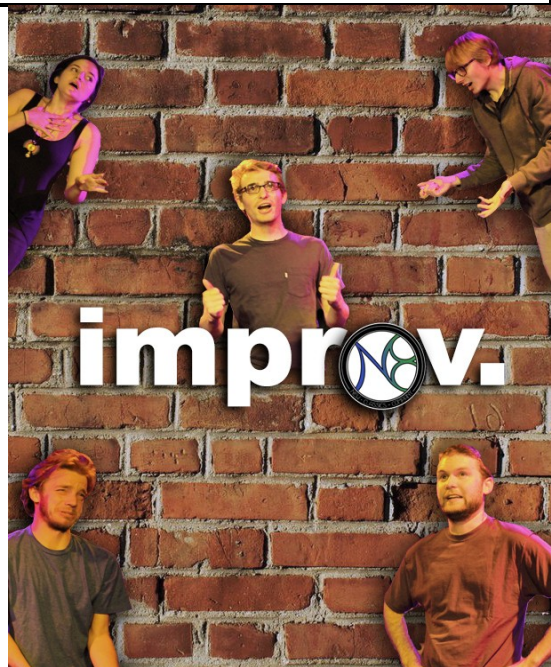
The Town of Barnstable Growth Management Department (GMD) is the lead agency for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). CDBG funds in amounts up to \$25,000 are now available for façade improvements and \$2,500 for sign improvements for commercial businesses located in downtown Hyannis in the designated program areas. Applicants are required to provide a one-to-one match, and property owner permission is necessary for tenants applying.
