November 7, 2017 – TOWN ELECTION – 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM.

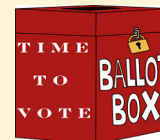

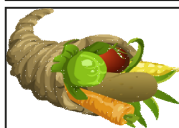

All elections are important and part of the election process is your completion of the **census/voter confirmation form** that goes out in January. This is a mandated law by the State and Federal governments that you confirm you still live at the same location. If you do not return the census, or did not receive one, you are made "inactive". You can still vote, but will be required to fill out an affirmation of continuous residence form. This takes extra time. Therefore, when you receive your census form in January, remember – this will avoid any delays at the polling place. If you have any doubts about your voter status, please call us on 508-862-4044.

Superintendent's Corner

When people think of the Fall, they associate it with apple picking, fall foliage, and shorter days. When school districts think of the Fall, we associate it with the release of MCAS results, and this Fall is no different. In mid-October, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education released the results of the Spring 2017 MCAS, referred to as the next-generation MCAS.

You might be wondering, what is the next-generation MCAS? And why did we move away from the legacy MCAS? In answer to the first, the next-generation MCAS is an updated version of the nearly 20-year old MCAS assessment. Barnstable's students in grades 3 – 8 were administered the next-generation MCAS this past Spring, while our grade 10 students were assessed using the legacy MCAS. The next-generation MCAS assesses students on their ability to apply their knowledge and make connections between reading and writing. It is an assessment that, by 2019, will be administered to all of our grade 3 – 8 students as an online assessment. As to the second question of why did we move away from the legacy MCAS for our grades 3 – 8 students, the next-generation MCAS is "designed to have coherent, consistent high standards from one grade to the next". The next generation MCAS is designed to identify where students are academically and make midcourse adjustments to get them back on track.

The next-generation MCAS also brings with it a change to the scoring categories. The legacy MCAS test identified the four performance levels as Advanced, Proficient, Needs Improvement, and Warning/Failing based on scaled scores ranging from 200 – 280. The next-generation MCAS designates the four scoring categories as Exceeding Expectations, Meeting Expectations, Partially Meeting Expectations, and Not Meeting Expectations with scaled scores ranging from 440 – 560. These new categories emphasize readiness for higher-level work at the next grade level. The Meeting Expectations standard gives a clear indication of students' readiness for the grade level they are moving into which over the course of their schooling experience, translates into college and career readiness.

Parents and guardians should expect to receive their child's score report at the end of October/ early November. The reports will provide you with overall results, content area information, as well as reporting categories and item level information. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education has put together a variety of resources to assist parents with the navigation of the MCAS reports. The resources can be found at <http://www.doe.mass.edu/mcas/parents/>

In the coming days and weeks, school and district leaders will be working with their staff to dig deep into the MCAS results which will help us to assess our curriculum, fine tune our instructional practices, and make sure we are providing our students with the learning they need.

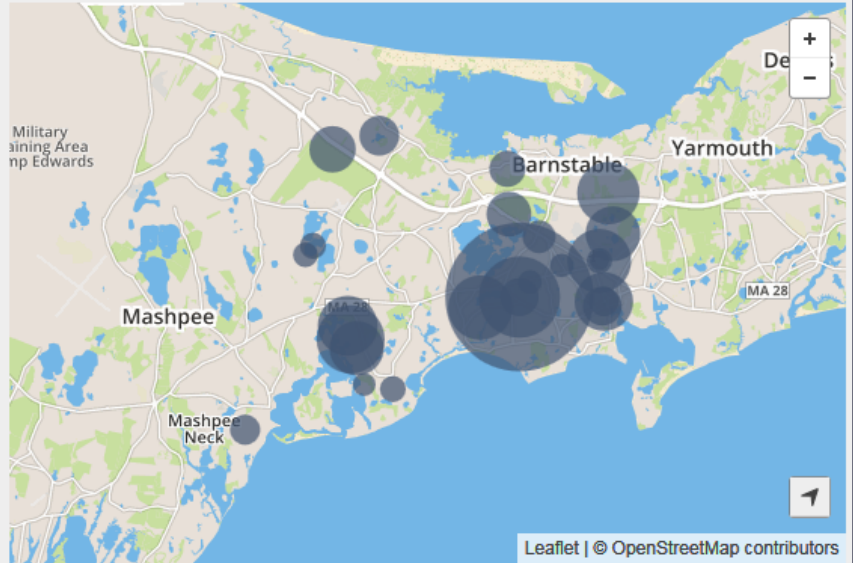

TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2017-072 JFK MUSEUM PLAZA REPLACEMENT

Description

This project would fund needed replacement of the failing bluestone plaza. These funds would provide for design, demolition, and construction. The JFK Hyannis Museum is one of the most highly used leased properties owned by the Town of Barnstable. 65,000 people visit the facility over the course of an average year. The existing Bluestone plaza is of low quality stone. The stone is degrading and creating trip hazards. There have been falls by pedestrians at this location due to deteriorated and displaced plaza stones. It is the intent to replace the failing plaza stone with a stamped concrete surface.

THE HARBORMASTER'S OFFICE WOULD LIKE TO REMIND ALL BOATERS



Unless a vessel owner secures written permission from Harbormaster staff for a proven need and that the vessel be actively used, no vessel shall be stored or placed on any Town property between November 15 and April 15. Any vessel placed or remaining between those dates shall be considered abandoned property under this regulation, and will be scrapped or otherwise disposed of by the Town. The Town of Barnstable shall not be responsible for damage to or theft of any vessel placed neither at this parcel nor for loss of property considered abandoned under this regulation.

Barnstable Elderly & Disabled Taxation Aid Fund



The Barnstable Town Council has accepted Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 60, Section 3D which allows the Town to establish a fund to defray the real estate taxes of low income elderly and disabled persons. Taxpayers

contribute to the fund through a voluntary check off on their real estate tax bills. The funds collected are distributed to needy individuals through an annual award process, which recipients need to meet eligibility requirements and complete and submit an application form.

Applications will be accepted through November 30, 2017.

Inside Barnstable Town Government Citizens Leadership Academy Winter Session Begins January 30th

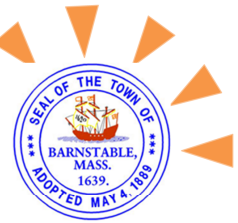

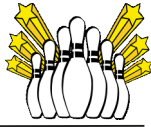

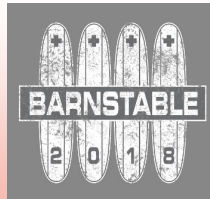
