FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

It is autumn, change is in the air, and big changes are happening this season at the Town Clerk's Office.



Early Voting:

Perhaps you have taken advantage of early voting this year. This is the second time early voting has been offered in Massachusetts. Early voting will be held October 22 through November 2, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM at the Town Clerk's office at Town Hall.

Precinct locations for One, Ten and Twelve:

Another change this year: the new location for Precinct 1 - the Zion Union Church at 805 Attucks Lane in Hyannis. Precincts 10 and 12 will cast their ballots at the 7th Day Adventist Church Community Building on Route 28 in Marstons Mills.

As I write this, we have mailed out over 1,000 absentee ballots. This number will probably continue to grow before the 6th of November. Absentee ballot requests will be honored until noon on November 5.

At noon on November 5, the Town Clerk's office will be closed for the remainder of the day to prepare all the materials necessary for delivery to the polling locations for the State Election.

Important Dates to Remember:

- November 2 Last day of early voting at Town Hall
- November 5 at NOON Close of requests for an absentee ballot-Town Clerk's office will be closed for the remainder of the afternoon
- November 6 State Election Day, all polling locations will be open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM

All elections are important and part of the election process is your completion of the census/voter confirmation form that goes out in January. This is a mandate by the State and Federal governments that you confirm you are still at the same location. If you do not return the census, or did not receive one, you are made "inactive." Again, that is a requirement of the law. You can still vote, but you will be required to fill out an affirmation of continuous residence form when you vote. This takes time. Therefore, when you receive your census form in a couple of months, remember – this will avoid any delays at the polling place. If you have any doubts about your voter status please call us on 508-862-4044.

You vote is your voice! Exercise your right to vote! All elections are important and your vote does count.

Superintendent's Corner



The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has a number of public school models, including Commonwealth Charters, Horace Mann Charters, Innovation Schools, Innovation Pathways, and Early College High Schools to name a few. Last October, the Barnstable School Committee held a workshop to learn more about an Innovation School model. The model was discussed as an option to consider within Barnstable Public Schools. When the Barnstable School Committee did not renew the Barnstable Community Horace Mann Charter Public School's (BCHMCPS) charter in June 2018, teachers at the school explored the Innovation School model as a way to continue autonomy in the areas of curriculum and instruction. Over the summer, several teachers from the BCHMCPS school put together a prospectus for the Innovation School that established a vision and mission for a proposed Barnstable Community Innovation School. The prospectus was approved by the Screening Committee, and a Planning Committee was formed to complete the Innovation School application. In October, the Planning Committee met with the School Committee to show them where they were within the application process, and to get feedback on their plans. The Planning Committee will continue to meet in November and December to complete the application. They will need a 2/3 vote from the licensed teachers at BCHMCPS before submitting the application to the School Committee for approval in January.

The Planning Committee wants to share with the Barnstable Community their proposal for a proposed Barnstable Community Innovation School:

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Exciting and innovative news to come for the elementary schools and families in the Town of Barnstable.

WHAT:

Over the summer of 2018 several Barnstable Community Horace Mann Charter Public School teachers met to investigate the possibility of converting to an Innovation School in response the School Committee's non-renewal of the Charter School. Teachers in the current school and the School Committee will have a chance to vote on the application.

WHO:

A Planning Committee has been created consisting of our Superintendent, a School Committee Member, a Principal, the Lead Applicant, Teachers, and Parents.

WHEN & WHERE:

The Committee began meeting on September 26, 2018, and will continue to meet every other week. The meetings are located in the conference room on the bottom floor of the School Administration building and are open to the public.



The Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanty Program

The Town of Barnstable is currently accepting applications for artists and artisans interested in participating in the 2019 Hyannis HyArts Cultural District Artist Shanty Program.

Applications are received on rolling basis until all spots are filled. Applications received by the fourth Friday in October of each year (this year October 26th) are reviewed for first round consideration for the following season. After this date, applications continue to be accepted on a rolling basis until all spots filled. Applications can be downloaded from www.ArtsBarnstable.com

Artist shanties are located in the Hyannis HyArts Cultural District, at Bismore Park/Ocean Street, Hyannis and steps away at the Harbor Overlook, 51 Ocean Street, at the corner of South and Ocean Street, overlooking Aselton Park and Hyannis Harbor.

The expansion of the Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanty program to two locations creates an additional attraction for visitors walking from Main Street to Hyannis Harbor through the Hyannis Village Green along the Walkway-to-the-Sea, and at the same time provides affordable selling space and increased exposure for local artists and artisans.

The Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanty Program began in 2005, as the first in a series of arts oriented strategies designed to provide opportunities and exposure for local artists; enliven the economic climate in downtown Hyannis; and establish an important vibrant backdrop for year round residents and visitors. The shanties are open weekends May through mid-June and then seven days a week through Columbus Day. The Harbor Overlook supports extended weekends in the fall through December holiday festivities. Work is handmade or hand crafted, and all artists are from Cape Cod. A variety of work is represented including jewelry, paintings, photography, visual art, woodcarving, fiber arts, ceramics, rope work, glass work, literary art, mixed media, and more.

This artist program is made possible in cooperation with the Town of Barnstable, and its Cultural District partners including the Cape Cod Art Center (CCAC), Hyannis Main Street Business Improvement District (BID), the Greater Hyannis Area Chamber of Commerce, the JFK Hyannis Museum and Cape Cod Maritime Museum.

Barnstable Elderly & Disabled Taxation Aid Fund



The Barnstable Town Council has accepted Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 60, Section 3D which allows the Town to establish a fund to defray the real estate taxes of low income elderly and disabled persons. Taxpayers contribute to the fund through a voluntary check off on their real estate tax bills. The funds collected are distributed to needy individuals through an annual award process, which recipients need to meet eligibility requirements and complete and submit an application form.
