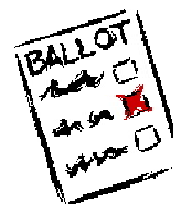

### FROM THE TOWN CLERK

#### September - Election News

The Town Clerk's office is gearing up for the first of two State/Federal Elections that will be held this fall. The Primary Election scheduled for Thursday, September 8, 2016 is a nominating election. In the Town of Barnstable, residents who vote in the Primary Election vote according to their party affiliation. At the Primary Election those registered in the **Democratic Party, Republican Party, Green Rainbow Party, and United Independent Party** will have to vote the ballot of their party. If you are **Unenrolled** or registered in a political designation such as Interdependent Third Party, or Pirate Party you may choose whatever ballot you want to vote.



Winning the party's nomination is the first step in the election process. This step narrows the field down to one candidate from each political party for the one specific office. The next step is the State Election on Tuesday, November 8, 2016.

All elections are important. Since there are multiple candidates for many positions, this is the time to get out and support your candidate.

In accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 53, Section 37, if you are Unenrolled, or a designation, the poll workers must ask you which ballot you are requesting, repeat that back to you and notate the voter list. Additionally, the poll workers at the check out table are required to ask you which ballot you chose, repeat that back to you and indicate the same on the voter list.

All changes to your voting status must have been made by August 19, 2016 in order for it to be in effect for September 8, 2016. You may make changes at any time to your voting status, however, changes within 20 days of an election will be held until just after the election.

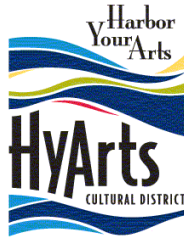

### Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program year-end report available for review and accepting comments through September 9, 2016.

The Town has completed the 2015 program year for the Community Development Block Grant program and is preparing Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report (CAPER) for the period July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016. The Town was awarded \$286,627 in federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to address the goals and objectives of the Town of Barnstable Consolidated Plan for 2015 – 2019. The CAPER is a year-end report that outlines the accomplishments of the Town's CDBG program and is available review and comments before the Town submits to HUD for approval.

### News from the Town Collector

We hope you are having a safe, happy, and healthy summer!

The FY2017 Preliminary Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were issued and mailed on July 1, 2016. The following is the schedule for payments:

#### Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2017

**Preliminary** Tax Bills were mailed by July 1, 2016

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2016
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 2, 2016

**Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 30, 2016**

- ✓ Third Quarter due February 1, 2017
- ✓ Fourth Quarter due May 3, 2017

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks processed in a timely manner. This service is only for the "open" period of the bill, which means that once the due date is reached, you should mail the payment to The Town of Barnstable, PO Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 to avoid a delay.

If you use your own on-line bill payment process, kindly check and make sure that the proper address is used for the mailing address (Town of Barnstable, PO Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601). These on-line checks must be processed manually and sending them to the Lockbox delays processing.

#### Cuba Today

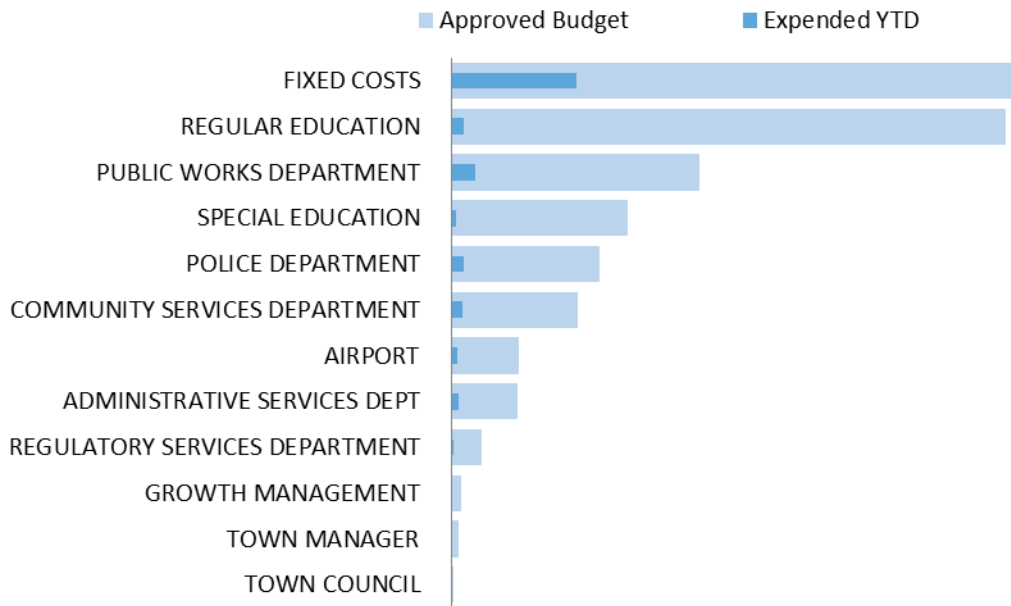

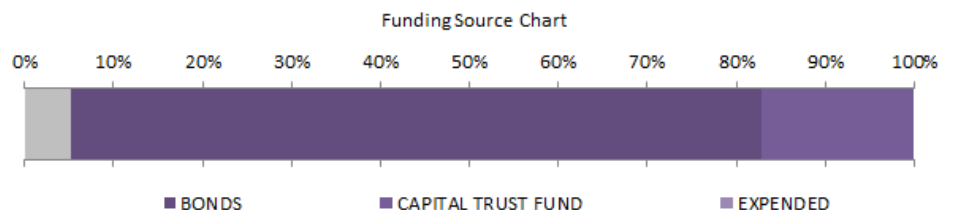
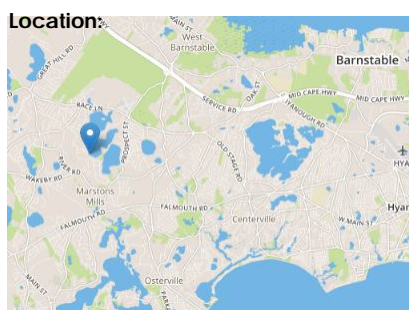

## Explore Capital Budget: Appropriations for infrastructure and improvement projects.

### 2014-108 MARSTONS MILLS FISH RUN - \$393,500

**Description:** The project consists of replacing the existing fish way structure that is constructed with a variety of materials, including plywood. It is proposed to remove the existing materials and replace with a standardized wood structure for the entire 1,100-foot run. The construction will create minimal disturbance to the immediate surroundings, as excavation for and construction of, the new fish way will be done within a confined space by means of a prefabricated trench box.

## News You Can Use

### **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS**

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

#### **Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan**

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones.

When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What is your evacuation route.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters **DO NOT** allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

#### **The Emergency Survival Kit**

*Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.*

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

#### **Remember, in the event of a severe storm:**

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!

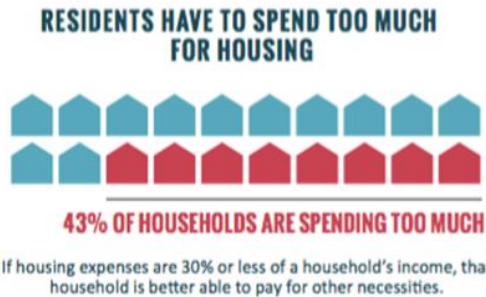

### HOUSING PRODUCTION PLAN UPDATE

The Growth Management Department with their consultant Jen Goldson has engaged stakeholders through focus groups that included Town staff, Town elected and appointed officials, non-profit agencies, and businesses; and held two public listening sessions in Hyannis and Osterville. These stakeholders provided thoughtful comments on housing production goals and strategies.



HPP outreach continued through the spring and summer months with visits to village civic associations and presentations and discussions with Town senior staff members and the Planning Board.
