FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

Here are a few important dates for all voters:

August 30th is the last day to register to vote for the September Special Election. Our office will be open until 8 PM. Please remember, you need to let us know if you have moved so we can update your voter registration.

September 19th is the Special Town Election. Polling locations will be open from 7 AM – 8 PM.

The question on the ballot for the Special Election is as follows:

"Shall the Town of Barnstable be allowed to exempt for the provisions of proposition two and one-half, so called, the amounts required to pay for the bond issued in order to construct a new school facility at the Cape Cod Regional Technical High School?" YES ____ NO____

(A **YES** vote would allow the Town to exempt the assessment received from the Regional School District for the debt service on the new school construction from the tax levy limit and levy ceiling. A **NO** vote will require the Town to absorb the additional cost of the debt service issued to build a new school within the Town's tax levy limit under Proposition 2½.)

The absentee ballots are in the office, so if you will be unable to vote on September 19th, come in to see us and cast your ballot. If you have a student away at college and if they are registered to vote and wish to vote in the Special Election. You, as a parent, can come in to the Town Clerk's office and fill out an absentee ballot application for your child. Make sure you have the college address so that it can be mailed directly to them. Please do this as soon as possible so that we can mail out the ballot right away.

For those of you who have not registered your dog, you will be required to pay a late fee in addition to the dog license fee. All dogs were to have the new tags on by July 1st. As of August 1st, you will be required to pay a \$5.00 late fee. If you register after December 31st you will pay a \$10.00 late fee, so time is money! You cannot skip a year. You need to register the dog annually, and will have to pay for any skipped year prior to acquiring a current license.

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed June 30, 2017. 1st Quarter **due** Aug. 1, 2017 2nd Quarter **due** Nov. 1, 2017 Actual Tax Bills mailed by Dec 29, 2017 3rd Quarter **due** Feb. 1, 2018 4th Quarter **due** May 1, 2018



Please check to make certain that you are up to date on your Real Estate taxes as many of the taxpayer's have not paid the prior year (FY2017) 4th quarter, which was due in May.

Please check to make sure you have updated any mailing address changes with the Assessor's office. The bills are mailed to the address on record.

Superintendent's Corner

Happy New School Year!

It is that wonderful time of year as we welcome back students and staff to the 2017-2018 school year. With over 5,000 students and more than 900 employees, including 500 professional staff, Barnstable is the largest K-12 school system on Cape Cod.

This past July, the School Committee adopted the official Vision for the district:

The Barnstable Public Schools educates the whole child by creating a student-centered school culture that addresses students' physical, social, emotional, and academic needs by creating a safe and healthy learning environment in which students are challenged, supported, and engaged.

With this new Vision, we will continue to implement Multi-Tiered System for Support (MTSS) throughout the district. This blueprint for a single integrated, tiered system of supports responsive to the academic and non-academic needs of all students will help us improve our practice and improve student achievement.

Over the past school year and into the summer, we are continuing to provide our students of all ages access to the latest technology. We have purchased over 2,000 Chromebooks, 230 iPads for Barnstable United Elementary School and redistributed iPads to elementary schools. Also in grades K-7, we have added a green screen, 3D printer, iMovie, Book Creator, Robotic kits, Scratch software, Snap Circuits, BeeBot kits and Dash kits. At the high school, we have partnered with *Project Lead the Way* for *Pathway to Engineering*. This program investigates topics such as aerodynamics and astronautics, biological engineering and sustainability and digital electronics and circuit design. In the Engineering Lab, students will be using the same industry-leading technology and software as the world's top companies.

As we educate our students with the latest technology, we also need to keep our teachers and staff up to date on the most effective ways to educate our students. This past spring, I requested additional Professional Development half days for our teachers and staff. The School Committee heard from administrators, teachers and staff how valuable this time is in their professional growth and the education of our students and granted these additional half days. The following dates will be Professional Development half days in the district: September 13, November 29, January 10, February 14, March 14, April 11 and May 2. There will be a full day of Professional Development on October 6 with no school for the students.

It is an exciting time to be part of the Barnstable Public Schools. The School Committee, administration, teachers and staff are all working hard to live the Vision of the district. Let's have a great year!



TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2014-106 SENIOR CENTER PARKING LOT EXPANSION

Currently the size of the existing lot is too small to accommodate the additional parking needed at many of their events. With the increase in participants in Senior Center activities, finding parking is difficult for the elderly citizens. With poor weather conditions and many events occurring in the evening, it is important to have good smooth pavement, adequate parking and lighting so that the liability to the Town is well managed. The FY 2014 Capital Improvements Program funded the design of the parking lot expansion.



HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken." There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.

- 1. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
- 3. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

- 1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
- 2. What is your evacuation route.
- 3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
- 4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
- 5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
- What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters <u>DO</u> <u>NOT</u> allow pets.
- 7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
- 8. Be sure any/all important documents are gathered in one place.
- 9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ♦ A basic first aid kit.
- Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

- 1. Secure all outdoor objects.
- 2. Stay away from windows.
- 3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
- 4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
- 5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!

The Town has completed the 2016 program year for the Community Development Block Grant program and is preparing **Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report (CAPER)** for the period July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017. The Town was awarded \$274,347 in federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to address the goals and objectives of the Town of Barnstable Consolidated Plan for 2015 – 2019. The CAPER is a year-end report that outlines the accomplishments of the Town's CDBG program and is available review and comments before the Town submits to HUD for approval.


