

Town Council Meeting January 22, 2015



quorum being duly present, Council President Jessica Rapp Grassetti called the January 22, 2015, Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Town Hall, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA.

An announcement was made by President Rapp Grassetti regarding the meeting being televised live and questioning if anyone was actively taping the session to please make their presence known. This session is recorded and broadcast on Channel 18.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Rapp Grassetti, followed by a Moment of Silence.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Bruce Blackman expressed his support of the shooting range and hoped Council would approve the land exchange.

Gleb Zelenoy hoped the shooting range will be opened as soon as it was financially and feasibly able to and added he and family had learned to respect weapons at the facility.

Bob Spalding spoke about his concerns on how much time was spent on the issue of the shooting range and suggested Council not support the land exchange.

Kate Mitchell urged Council to not support the land exchange.

Linda Kerrin did not support the shooting range due to concerns with noise from the shooting range and felt an environmental study was needed.

Richard Nese discussed Proposition 2.5; Community Preservation Act; Dump searches and hoped the shooting range would open.

Jim Feeney felt it was ridiculous that the shooting range was closed and urged Council to find a compromise for all.

Cate Sullivan urged Council to commence with a study for the Stewart Creek's project.

Karen McGuire was supportive of the \$40,000 study for the Stewart Creek's project and added it was imperative to get to the bottom of this issue.

Barry Blanchard spoke about the Army Corp of Engineers running out of money and the causality of the Stewart Creek's dredging.

Mark Wirtam read letter regarding testing of well water and hoped the water clean up began before the project progressed.

COUNCILOR RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENT:

Councilor Cullum thanked the residents who spoke regarding Stewart's Creek.

Councilor Hebert also thanked all residents who came out to express their opinions and reiterated that everyone rights/privileges needs to be protected.

Councilor Wallace expressed his concerns with the shooting range.

Council Dagwan explained her opposition to the land exchange but clarified her openness to the shooting range.

Council James Crocker hoped for a day that the Town did not have to utilize Proposition 2.5 and mentioned some issues were healthcare and retirement benefits.

Councilor Norman suggested Council refrain from using Town resident statistics/and or assigning population percentages.

Rationale given by Dan Santos, Director of Public Works. Open public hearing.

Bilton Berger [abutter to Stewart's Creek] had concerns with scope of the study. Need to make sure the study includes the area west channel; free flowing stream and dredging.

Karen McQueen [abutter to Stewart's Creek] felt there needed to be a technical evaluation.

Concrned with increase modeling that needs to happen. This area Stewart's creek is heart of the community. Increase money to \$50,000 [appropriation cannot increase money but can decrease or can expand order with Town Manager approval and will have to be advertised again per code.]
