#### **REMINDERS FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE**

Summertime is flying by and we are hoping we will have a beautiful warm fall. The State Elections are just around the corner.

#### Important Dates to Remember:

**ABSENTEE BALLOTS** will be available in the Town Clerk's Office approximately the first week of August. If you need to vote absentee, come into the office after August 6<sup>th</sup> and we will be happy to help you. Absentee balloting closes at 4:30 PM on Friday, August 31<sup>st</sup>.

**AUGUST 15<sup>TH</sup>** – Voter registration closes for the September election; if you are already registered you do not have to re-register. But if you have moved, please check with the Town Clerk's office prior to **August 15<sup>th</sup>** to make sure you are still eligible to vote.

**SEPTEMBER 4<sup>TH</sup>** – State Primary Election, come out and cast your ballot, remember your vote is your voice! If you are registered as UNENROLLED, you need to declare which ballot you want to vote. If you are registered as a Democrat, Republican or Libertarian...YOU MUST TAKE THAT BALLOT! Polls will be open in all thirteen (13) precincts from 7 AM to 8 PM.

OCTOBER 17<sup>TH</sup> – Voter registration closes for the **November State Election**. If you are already registered you do not have to re-register. But if you have moved, please check with the Town Clerk's office prior to **October 17<sup>th</sup>** to make sure you are still eligible to vote.

**OCTOBER 22<sup>nd</sup> –** The first day of early voting right here at the Town Clerk's office at 367 Main Street in Hyannis; the final day of early voting is Friday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Absentee ballots will be available on or about October 9<sup>th</sup>; the final day for absentee voting will be noon on Monday, November 5<sup>th</sup>.

**NOVEMBER 6<sup>TH</sup> – STATE ELECTION** - Please come out to vote, for Senator in Congress, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Auditor, Representative in Congress, Councillor, Senator in General Court, Representative in General Court, District Attorney, Clerk of Courts, Register of Deeds, and County Commissioner. All 13 polling locations will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM.

Absentee Ballots are available before every election. If you are planning to be away or are not available during the elections, please call (508-862-4044) to see if the ballots are in so that you may come to the Clerk's office and vote before you leave.

#### A Note From The Town Collector's Office:

We hope you are having a safe, happy, and healthy summer! The FY2019 Preliminary Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were issued and mailed. The following is the schedule for payments:



- Preliminary Tax Bills were mailed June 29, 2018
- Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by Dec 31, 2018
- 1st Quarter **due** Aug. 1, 2018
- 3rd Quarter **due** Feb. 1, 2019
  - 2nd Quarter **due** Nov. 1, 2018 4th Quarter **due** May 1, 2019

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks getting processed in a timely manner. This service is only for the "open" period of the bill, which means that once the due date is reached, you should mail the payment to The Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 to avoid a delay.

If you use your own on-line bill payment process, would you kindly check and make sure that the proper address is used for the mailing address (Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601)? These online checks must be processed manually and sending them to the Lockbox delays the processing.



#### School Facilities Department Hard at Work this Summer

While the students and many of the staff are enjoying their time off this summer, the Facilities Department led by Dave Kanyock is hard at work on several projects across the district.

#### BHS 21st Century Learning Center

The BHS library is getting a facelift and a new name: 21st Century Learning Center. The space will be

equipped with computers and different areas for studying in groups or in quiet spaces. The room will have a special glass wall that changes its tint based on



the amount of sunlight hitting the glass. This technology will help keep the room temperatures comfortable and save on the energy used in the space. Construction on the space has begun with an expected completion date of November 1st.

These are the larger projects the Facilities Department is working on this summer. They are also cleaning the buildings and maintaining the grounds of all nine of the district's schools. Thank you to Dave Kanyock and his team for all their hard work over the summer and all year long!

Have you ever wanted to learn how to shellfish? Have you been before, but you're still looking for more tips? Here is your chance! Natural Resources staff and town shellfish volunteers will be available to assist anyone who wants to learn to dig quahogs and steamers or just to get a few more pointers!

Be prepared to get wet! The shellfish live in wet sand that gets

covered by saltwater when the tide is high. Waders, hip boots or knee boots would be helpful. Protective gloves are necessary. Shellfish may be taken by hand or rake. Small (garden) hand rakes and trowels will be allowed for children only. Shellfish that are legally harvested with a valid permit may be taken home. SHELLFISH REGULATIONS APPLY AS ALWAYS!
