Work continues on our formal budget preparation. The budget process is really something we do all year round. The winter months are when town staff prepares the Capital Budget and the Operating Budget for presentation

to the Town Council in March and May, respectively.

For the 17th consecutive year, Barnstable has again received the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award. The award demonstrates the commitment of the Town's governing body and staff to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. FEBRUARY NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE



The weather outside is frightful, so as you warm up by your firesides, take a moment to fill out your census/street listing forms. We have been receiving census returns daily and are diligently scanning and adding the information into our computers. Please keep up the good work!

Make any changes necessary on your census form and send it back to this office. You can mail it back to us, drop it off at your local library, or drop it off in our office. Even if there are no changes, we still need you to sign the form and send it back to us. This will keep you up to date on the Voter Registration System, making the voting process easier for you.

This form must be completed for all people residing in the Town of Barnstable (not just citizens or voters). This is in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Remember when your children are applying for scholarships, they have to prove residency in Massachusetts – it is from the local census and our certification that creates that proof. When military personnel return from overseas and need residency confirmed for welcome home bonuses – it is our office, and the information from the census forms, that allow us to sign that form as well.

You can't register to vote on the form or make any changes to your voter registration. If you wish to make changes to your voter status, you can register on line at www.sec.state.ma.us, or pick up a mail in form at any of our local libraries or at the Town Clerk's Office.

Reminders from the Town Collector

The FY2018 Actual Real Estate bill for the third quarter is due on February 1, 2018.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR FISCAL 2018

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2017 First Quarter due August 1, 2017 Second Quarter due November 1, 2017 Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 29, 2017 **Third Quarter due February 1, 2018** Fourth Quarter due May 1, 2018

The 2018 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills should be ready to be issued this month. This is the largest commitment issued by the Registry of Motor Vehicles. There are several commitments issued throughout the year. Please do not ignore these bills! If you sold or no longer own the vehicle, you must contact the Assessor's office for filing of an abatement. Unpaid Motor Vehicle Excise bills do not go away! Interest and penalties for unpaid bills add additional monies to the base charge of the bill and can "flag" your license at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

Any request for information regarding amount of monies paid for real estate, personal property and motor vehicle excise taxes for income tax filings must be made in writing to our office. We do not give the information out by telephone due to the number of telephone calls received as we would not get our day to day responsibilities done.

Superíntendent's Corner Budget Season

Budget season is underway in Barnstable. It began back in September when the Town Manager and I agreed to continue the 60/40 revenue sharing agreement. At the end of September, the School Committee and Town Council held their joint meeting where Finance Director Mark Milne and Deputy Finance Director Gareth Markwell presented the town's annual financial forecast. In December and January, Directors and Principals submitted their budget requests and had individual meetings with Mr. Markwell and me.

At the February 7 School Committee meeting, Mr. Markwell and I will present a preliminary school department budget for FY19. We will submit a more detailed proposed budget at the School Committee meeting on February 28. On March 21, the School Committee will hold a public hearing on the budget. The Committee may vote on the budget following the public hearing on March 21 or may wait until its April 4 meeting to vote. Under the town charter, the school department budget must be transmitted to the Town Manager by April 5. In June, there will be a first reading of the budget to the Town Council along with a public hearing and Comprehensive Financial Advisory Committee review, and finally the budget will be adopted.

Barnstable United Elementary School Principal Search Committee

The Barnstable United Elementary School Principal Search Committee is made up of 11 members including teachers, administration, district personnel, parent and School Committee member. The interviews began on January 29 and will go through February 5. The Committee aims to move forward two finalists to me before the February vacation break. The Committee is enthusiastic and positive they will bring in a principal who will move Barnstable United Elementary School forward.

The Committee has set up a "BUES Principal Qualities Survey" on the Barnstable.k12.ma.us website where the community can take a survey to voice their opinions of what they are looking for in the new principal of Barnstable United Elementary School. I would like to thank Dr. Jane Jezard and the BUES Principal Search Committee for their work and I know they will do a great job in bringing me finalists that will lead Barnstable United Elementary School into the future.

I would also like to thank Gareth Markwell, Directors and Principals for their work and thoughtfulness when putting forth budgets that are student centered. When this budget is put together, we are led by the District's goals, Core Values and the following District Vision:

The Barnstable Public Schools educate the whole child by creating a student centered school culture that addresses students' physical, social, emotional, and academic needs by creating a safe and healthy learning environment in which students are challenged, supported, and engaged.



Call to Artists for the 2018 Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanties. New this year, two locations! Bismore Park & Hyannis Harbor Overlook, corner of South and Ocean along the Walkway-to-the-Sea

The Town of Barnstable is currently accepting applications for artists and artisans interested in participating in the 2018 Hyannis HyArts Cultural District Artist Shanty program. Artist

shanties are located in the Hyannis HyArts Cultural District, at Bismore Park, Ocean Street, Hyannis and NEW this season, three additional shanties at the Harbor Overlook, along the Walkway-to-the-Sea, at the corner of South and Ocean Street, overlooking Aselton Park, Hyannis.

Expansion of the Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanty program creates an additional opportunity to connect visitors walking from Main Street to the Harbor front with local artists. And for artists and artisans it provides increased exposure and selling opportunities in affordable, highly visible studio space.

Artists will be juried as applications are received and applications are accepted on a rolling basis for remaining spots for the 2018 season. Spots are filled based on need and availability. Applications can be downloaded from www.ArtsBarnstable.com.

The Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanty Program began in 2005, as the first in a series of arts related strategies designed to provide opportunities and exposure for local artists; enliven the economic climate in downtown Hyannis; and to establish an important vibrant backdrop for year round residents and visitors.

The shanties are open weekends May through mid-June and then seven days a week through Columbus Day in October. The Harbor Overlook shanties will remain open weekends, October through December, 2018. Work is handmade or hand crafted, and all artists are from Cape Cod. A variety of work is represented including jewelry, paintings, photography, visual art, woodcarving, fiber arts, ceramics, rope work, glass work, literary art, mixed media, and more.



A Presence in the Land Its

A view of Sandy Neck through the eyes of Barnstable High School Art Students

This past fall the students from Barnstable High School's Fine Arts 4 class participated in a field trip out to the Sandy Neck House at the Halfway Point, so called because of its location half way down the inner rim of Sandy Neck. The building, more of a nature camp than a house, is nestled in the maritime forest perched above the Barnstable Great Marsh. It overlooks a thick matted patch of marsh grass, Osprey nesting sites, and a cluster of bird houses opening up to a view of Barnstable Harbor.

The students were tasked with combining what they had previously researched regarding the ecology, history, topography, and conservation aspects of Sandy Neck with their experiences journeying out to the halfway point. Accompanying them were Town of Barnstable Sandy Neck Beach Park Ranger Sean Kortis, naturalist Andrea Higgins, and Barnstable High School art teachers Jackie Reeves and Matt Kemp. During the day the students observed baby diamondback terrapins saved by the town's conservation efforts, viewed multiple tracks from a range of Sandy Neck fauna, explored the trails s naking through the maritime forest, gathered materials, and created a series of plein air sketches.

The students then created a range of artistic responses, utilizing a variety of techniques including photo collage, mixed media painting, traditional a crylic painting, and kinetic sculpture. These pieces tell the story of the interaction between two of Barnstable's greatest resources — The natural beauty of Sandy Neck and the bright, talented, and inspiring students of Barnstable High School.




