




# BARNSTABLE'S BUDGET as of May 12th








Personnel costs are the largest component of the budget. These costs are typically static and should track in line with payroll. Therefore, as of May 11th payroll, personnel cost should be in line with 85% of a department's personnel budget.





Excluding fixed cost and snow/ice removal cost, the General Fund operating budget as of May 11th is tracking 79% of overall budget.

Enterprise Funds are in line with expectations. Airport and HYCC are slightly higher due to personnel costs and facilities maintenance.

Barnstable's Natural Resources Program will offer three FREE shellfishing classes for young people: SATURDAY JUNE 24 @ 7:00 AM at Bridge St. Landing, Osterville SUNDAY JUNE 25 @ 7:00 AM at Bridge St. Landing, Osterville

- Natural Resources staff and town shellfish volunteers will be available to assist any young digger who wants the help.
- → Be prepared to get wet! The shellfish live in wet sand that gets covered by saltwater when the tide is high. Waders, hip boots or knee boots would be helpful. Protective gloves are necessary.
- $\sqrt{\ }$  Shellfish may be taken by hand or rake. Small (garden) hand rakes and trowels will be allowed for the young diggers.
- √ Attendees will receive a free "Clammer Kid" badge and an activity booklet.
- $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$  Shellfish that are legally harvested may be taken home.
- $\sqrt{}$  Certificates of Completion for this Clamming Class for Kids will be handed out as you leave with your catch.
- √ SHELLFISH REGULATIONS APPLY AS ALWAYS!

### SUMMER SEASONAL SERVICE BETWEEN NEW YORK AND HYANNIS BEGINS IN JUNE

Travelers flying between New York's JFK Airport and Hyannis, MA on Cape Cod will again have a direct option as JetBlue begins its seasonal service between the two airports on Thursday, June 15. The customer-friendly airline will be offering nonstop flights through Sunday, September 24 aboard a 100-seat Embraer E190 twin-engine jet, an aircraft with a reputation for safety, as well as quiet takeoffs and landings.

"We are once again thrilled to have JetBlue back in Hyannis for the summer season," says Barnstable Municipal Airport Manager Bud Breault "Customers have already been asking whether they can purchase tickets for the route which shows how much Cape Cod and travelers coming from New York are enjoying the convenience."

Inbound flights from New York are scheduled to arrive in Hyannis at 12:17PM; flights are due to depart for New York about 40 minutes later, at 12:54 PM.

This year the popular JetBlue flights will extend deep into September with flights four times a week between Friday, September 8 through Sunday, September 24.

"First launched in 2014, our Hyannis service is a win-win for JetBlue customers on both sides of this great route," said John Checketts, director route planning, JetBlue. "Whether seeking out the calm coastline of Cape Cod, or visiting the bustle of Broadway in the city that never sleeps,



fliers are less than an hour away from the attractions of their favorite summertime escape." Customers who use Barnstable Municipal Airport to travel to Nantucket will also have several airlines to consider as they travel to the island this summer. Cape Air & Nantucket Airlines and Rectrix Shuttle will continue to offer daily options to the island.
