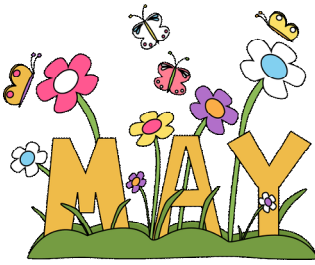

Hello Barnstable: We are selling the 2018 dog tags for your canine starting the first week of May. In the next edition of the bulletin, after the voting has finished we will feature Barnstable's Best Dog!

You can renew your dog's license by mail by sending to us the following: a stamped self-address envelope; a check for \$7.00 for a spayed or neutered animal, or \$10.00 for a male or female dog; a copy of the current rabies certificate (if it has been updated recently). Please include your email address.

This will enable us to send out a reminder for next year's dog licensing! Mail all of the above to: Town Clerk, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA 02601. You may also renew the dog license in person, here at Town Hall during regular office hours (Monday through Friday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM).

I want to send out a big thank you to all the dog owners who entered their favorite canine in the contest. It is so much fun to see all the great photos. The visitors to our office enjoy looking at them and voting for their favorite dog! Remember you must have a new tag on your dog by July. To avoid having to pay late fees renew your license now!!! Remember our dog year runs from July 1st to June 30th. These new tags will be required to be on your dog's collar by July 1st.

FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE TOWN COLLECTOR'S OFFICE:

Fourth Quarter Real Estate and Personal Property Tax bills are due May 1, 2018.

The first commitment of Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills was issued on February 21, 2018 and was due on March 23, 2018 and the second commitment has also been issued on April 4, 2018 and due on May 4, 2018. There are several commitments issued each year for the current year and also for prior years. These bills should be paid timely to avoid interest and penalties. If a bill is issued, it does not go away! You must pay the excise or file for an abatement with the Assessor's office if you no longer own the vehicle and should be done by the due date to avoid interest and penalties.

Superintendent's Corner

Welcome to Spring! It's the time of year for growth and new beginnings. At Barnstable Public Schools, spring is a time when we are looking forward and planning for the next school year. Several initiatives are underway: the School Committee approved the 2018-2019 School Operating Budget, the Town Council has approved the school projects in the Capital Improvement Plan budget, and Barnstable Public Schools is currently searching for new principals at Barnstable West Barnstable Elementary School and Barnstable United Elementary School and a new Executive Director of Special Education due to the upcoming retirement of Dr. Jane Jezard.

2018-2019 School Operating Budget

At the April 4th School Committee Meeting, the School Committee approved the fiscal year 2019 operating budget. The budget will now go to the Town Council for a vote. The total operating budget request is \$70,066,620. The largest expense is salary and wages at \$51,657,811. Other expenses include supplies, contracted services and one-time operating capital expenditures. The sources that pay for these expenses come from appropriation, school choice fees, transportation fees, circuit breaker and the School Committee savings account.

Capital Improvement Plan

At the April 5th Town Council Meeting, the Town Council approved five projects for the School Department. The largest of these projects is a \$4.6 million Barnstable High School Sports Field Upgrade Project which contributes to our district vision of educating the whole child. The other projects include district wide communication, video surveillance and entry improvements, Barnstable High School and Barnstable Intermediate School roof top unit ventilator replacement, elementary school unit ventilator replacement and an emergency generator replacement at West Villages Elementary School.



Principal and Executive Director of Special Education Searches

Barnstable Public Schools currently has open positions for principals at Barnstable West Barnstable Elementary School ("BWB") and Barnstable United Elementary School ("BUES"), as well as the Executive Director of Special Education. The Executive Director of Special Education job posting has closed and a search committee consisting of administration, teachers, and parents is interviewing potential candidates. The BUES principal job posting has closed and two finalists selected by central office are being vetted by the teachers, parents and staff at BUES. The BWB principal position is open to applicants. Once the position closes, it will follow the same process at BUES with central office interviewing candidates before selecting finalists to be vetted by BWB teachers, parents and staff.

As the current school year winds down, we are well underway in planning for the 2018-2019 school year. Our 2018-19 school year begins on August 27 for school staff and August 29 for all students in grades 1-12. Our school year calendar can be found at www.barnstable.k12.ma.us.

FY18 Capital Budget Summary - General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Sewer Construction and Private Way Fund, and Community Preservation Fund

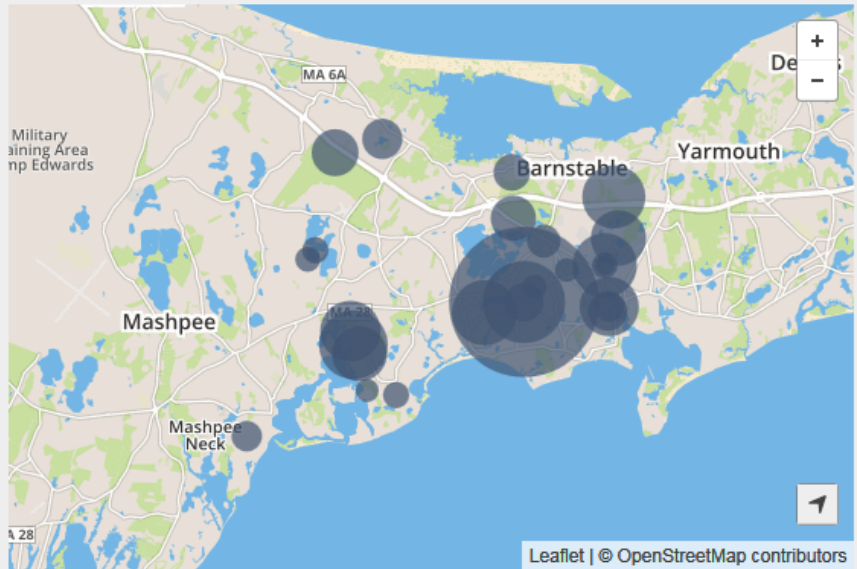

TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2016-100 KALMUS BEACH IMPROVEMENTS

Description

The first project will clean and repave the entire existing asphalt parking and access area. Re-striping all parking stalls and traffic markings. Improving storm drainage systems. Existing paving is deteriorating, failure to repair now with a thin pavement overlay will result in the need for a more extensive and expensive fix in the future. Poor surface drainage is contributing to pavement deterioration and inconveniencing users of the facility. The second project will replace the existing Craigville Bathhouse septic system. The existing septic system at the Craigville Bathhouse failed its Board of Health required inspection. As a result, the system needs to be replaced within the next two years, or alternative means to address the bathhouse wastewater needs to be implemented.

NEWS FROM HYANNIS HYARTS CULTURAL DISTRICT:

A sure sign of warmer days, the Hyannis HyArts Artist Shanties at Hyannis Harbor open for the season, Friday, May 4th at 11:00 am.

Visitors can find something handmade or hand crafted by Cape Cod artists and artisans.

Artists take up 'residence' in two locations this year: Bismore Park and Hyannis Harbor Overlook. The shanties feature local artists and artisans who work and sell their wares right from their 'seaside studios'! Over 95 artists will participate this year; work and artists vary each week as the artists rotate throughout the season.

A variety of work is represented including jewelry, paintings, photography, visual art, woodcarving, fiber arts, ceramics, rope work, glass work, literary art, mixed media, and more!

Musical entertainment is scheduled throughout the season at both shanty locations.

The shanties are open weekends (Friday through Sunday) May 4th through June 10th, including the Monday of Memorial Day weekend; then seven days a week, every day through Columbus Day. The Harbor Overlook shanties will remain open weekends, October through December, 2018.

SUMMER SERVICE TO/FROM NYC BEGINS MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND!

Travelers flying between New York's JFK Airport and Hyannis, MA on Cape Cod will again have a direct option as JetBlue Airlines begins their seasonal service between the two airports on Friday, May 25th for the 5th year in a row. The popular airline will be offering flights on Memorial Day weekend with service on the 25th (Friday) and the 28th (Monday). Then from June 1st through

the 10th, they will operate on Fridays and Sundays. Finally, from June 14th through September 4th, they will fly the route daily with direct flights seven times a week. Below is the current schedule:

All flights will be aboard a 100-seat Embraer E190 twin-engine jet, an aircraft with a reputation for safety, as well as quiet takeoffs and landings. Ticket information is available via JetBlue's website at JetBlue.com

Additionally, JetBlue passengers and anyone visiting the Airport will have access to delicious coffee from Cape Cod Coffee, now located in the Terminal Café adjacent to the JetBlue ticket counter. The company has been in business for 47 years and operates a store at Mashpee Commons. In addition to coffee, the cafe also sells pastries, bagels, grab and go salads, muffins, sandwiches, chips and their famous donuts, made daily on site. Furthermore, the Café has applied for and are getting a license to serve alcohol and have teamed their coffee with local businesses (beer from Cape Cod Beer, wine from First Crush, and liquor from Cape & Island Distillers). We are thrilled to have this café open as an option to travelers looking for a quick bite to eat in the terminal or as a takeout option and remember, parking is always free for non-travelers when visiting the café!

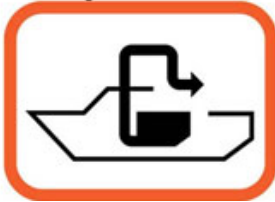

Pumpout Boat



The Barnstable Pumpout Boats are in service for the boating season beginning Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend. As the boating season is underway, the pumpout boats will be running seven days a week. The boats can be easily identified. Both boats are white center console vessels with the lettering "HARBORMASTER" on both sides. The pumpout boats monitor VHF channels 16 and 09 during operating hours. 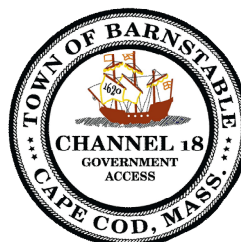
