I want to recognize the patience of our citizens and visitors as the Town of Barnstable continues with a multitude of roadway projects. I know that such projects cause inconveniences to our daily routine, but I am sure our citizens will be pleased with the results.

TOWN CLERK REMINDERS FOR NOVEMBER...

It is autumn, change is in the air, and big changes are happening this season at the Town Clerk's Office.

Early Voting:

Perhaps you have taken advantage of early voting this year. This is the first time early voting has been offered in Massachusetts. Early voting will be held October 24th through November 4th, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM at Town Hall. Additionally, on October 29th at the Barnstable Police Department, from 8 AM until 2 PM. This is a new and exciting experience for all of us.



Temporary Move of Precinct 11:

Another change this year: Precinct 11 will be voting at Barnstable-West Barnstable Elementary School, located at 2463 Main Street, West Barnstable. After a compliance review conducted by the United States Attorney's Office, the West Barnstable Community Building does not meet the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design. We are hoping this will be a temporary move!.

As I write this, we have mailed out over 600 absentee ballots. This number is expected to triple by the 8th of November. Absentee ballot requests will be honored until noon on November 7th. At noon on November 7th, the Town Clerk's office will be closed for the remainder of the day to prepare all the materials necessary for delivery to the polling locations for the State Election.

2016 Important Dates to Remember:

October 19th - Last day to register to vote for the November 8th State Election

October 24th - Early voting begins at Town Hall

October 29th – Early voting on Saturday at the Barnstable Police Department

November 4th - Last day of early voting at Town Hall

November 7th – at NOON, close of requests for an absentee ballot-Town Clerk's office will be closed for the remainder of the afternoon.

November 8th - State Election Day, all polling locations will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM

All elections are important and part of the election process is your completion of the census/voter confirmation form that goes out in January. This is a mandate by the State and Federal governments that you confirm you are still at the same location. If you do not return the census, or did not receive one, you are made "inactive". Again, that is a requirement of the law. You can still vote, but will be required to fill out an affirmation of continuous residence form when you vote. This takes time. Therefore, when you receive your census form in a couple of months, remember – this will avoid any delays at the polling place. If you have any doubts about your voter status please call us on 508-862-4044.

You vote is your voice! Exercise your right to vote! All elections are important and your vote does count.

Greetings!

Gratitude. November brings opportunities to express our gratitude in traditional and unique ways. Whether surrounded by family and friends at Thanksgiving, or honoring our veterans for their service, this time of year offers reflection and appreciation. As I reflect on upon my short time in Barnstable, I am grateful for our community's commitment to our youngest citizens. Barnstable Public Schools educates over 5,000 children from preschool through high school. Not only are our educators and support staff committed to meeting the needs of our students, but also our community at large consistently unites to support our students in and out of school.

This month two organizations are bringing our community together to support our students. First, on November 12th the Barnstable Educational Foundation is hosting their 2nd Annual 5K/10K Run or 5K Walk for Success. The event is in memory of Sheila Burns, beloved former principal of Centerville Elementary School. Through fundraising and donations, the Barnstable Educational Foundation provides grants to Barnstable teachers for creative projects and innovative programming.

Similarly, and new this year, the Greater Hyannis Area Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring a 5K Barnstable Harvest Family Walk-Run on Saturday, November 19th to inaugurate funding for a school-based food pantry at Barnstable High School. Why is a school-based food pantry necessary at the high school? According to Feeding America about seven million American children and teenagers (ages 10-17) struggle with hunger. Outside of the school day, older students grapple with a wide range of strategies to get by, coping with hunger in different ways. Teen hunger can often go unnoticed as teens struggle with possible stigma. Teen hunger is real, serious and affects the mind, body, and soul, all of which impact learning and overall health and wellness. As our flagship school, Barnstable High School will lead the way to enhance our caring community.

These are just two examples of many – our community supports our students in untold ways to ensure our Barnstable students thrive. It is with tremendous gratitude that we thank our Barnstable community.

A REMINDER TIME TO RENEW YOUR BURGLAR ALARM REGISTRATION

WITH THE BARNSTABLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

All burglar alarm registrations within the Town of Barnstable will expire on **December 31, 2016.** If you are an Alarm User, commercial or residential, monitored or non-monitored, you need to renew your Alarm Registration and get your 2017/2018 decal. Please complete a 2017/2018 Alarm Registration renewal form and submit with a \$25.00 registration fee. Renewal forms are available at the Barnstable Police Department or online at www.barnstablepolice.com. Please renew by the expiration date (12/31/2016) to avoid costly late fees and unregistered alarm fines. If you have any questions regarding the renewal please call 508-778-3824.

No vessel shall be stored or placed on any Town property between November 15 and April 15 without written permission from the Harbormaster. The Town of Barnstable shall not be responsible for damage to or theft neither of any vessel placed nor for loss of property considered abandoned under this Town's regulation.

Harbor Community Health Dentist, Dr. Shanti Kandala will offer a presentation on caring for teeth and gums along with the importance of doing so for the entire body.



HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

- 1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets.

 Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
- 2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
- 3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
- 4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.
