Included in this charge is a late fee since all dogs were to be licensed by July 1, 2016. Please do so immediately in order to avoid an additional fine.






Plastic Bag Ban Begins October 3, 2016

October Greetings!

Our 2016-17 school year is off to a strong start as we focus on providing our 5,000 students with an exceptional education. During my short time within the community, I have learned that Barnstable Public Schools is a proud world community with over 30 languages spoken in grades prekindergarten to grade 12. Our diverse student community is one of many strengths of our school system, as we prepare our students to graduate college and career ready in a global economy. Moreover, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education has announced our most diverse school, Hyannis West Elementary, has been designated as a Level 1 school. This designation is the highest accountability designation a school can receive, indicating the school is meeting or exceeding its state targets for student learning. We congratulate our Hyannis West educators, students and families for this important designation.

As Barnstable's new superintendent, I am spending these early months connecting with stakeholders in our schools, and within our broader community, to learn where the system has been, where it stands now, and where it wants to be as we move forward together. School districts are complex organizations comprised of multiple stakeholders who contribute to the development of our youngest citizens. A comprehensive entry plan is guiding my developing understanding of Barnstable Public Schools, creating the foundation for collective planning and decision-making. I look forward to learning more about our community's hopes and dreams for our students in the months ahead!

News from Consumer Affairs- Sealer of Weights and Measures October 2016 Back to School Survey

"Yes I am convinced that the Weights and Measures system in this country has been a tremendous success. Our shoppers by the millions shop every day and make tens of millions of purchases based on weight, measure and count. They shop in the well- placed belief that they will not be cheated. You make confidence in the honesty of the market a fact. Your predecessors built the heritage which makes the slogan "Equity in the marketplace" a proud and real tradition, a tradition in which every one of us should be proud."

Mr. Tholen's words are a prevalent today as they were back in 1979, we are all consumers and none of us want to be cheated. All these loyalty cards, member cards give deals if we spend so much we will get rewarded. On the occasion we get overcharged or the deal was not such a deal, you have the Consumer Affairs Weights and Measures team to help you out.

Item Price Inspector Jaime Cabot went out to check some "back to school" sales for price accuracy at four locations Sears; Best Buy; Five Below and Ocean State Job Lot. His mission was to check back packs, art and school supplies, lap tops and accessories, and some clothing that were advertised in flyers for these stores the week of August 15, 2016.

Following the same procedure we use when doing a scanner accuracy inspection also known as Price Verification. He scanned 25 items at each location which resulted in 100% accuracy at each location. As enforcers of the pricing of many stores in our jurisdiction we were very pleased at this result.

However, if you ever come across a discrepancy on a purchase or if you have any questions or concerns regarding the performance of a commercial weighing or measuring device used for trade, bring it to the attention of the merchant. If the problem is not resolved, contact the local Weights & Measures office for advice and/or assistance. The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes; Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Chatham, Dennis, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.

News from the Town Collector

Where did the summer go? This is the question we are asking in the Town Collector's office and I am sure many of you are asking the same question.

It has been a very busy year for me and my staff and we are rapidly approaching the due date of the real estate and personal property tax bills for the second quarter of FY2017, which will be due on November 2. PLEASE NOTE: you should have the coupon that indicates the amount due for the November remit, which was mailed in the three part bill back on July 1, 2016. If you have any questions, please call our office at **508-862-4054**. This is the taxpayers responsibility! We have been on a quarterly billing system since FY06 and many taxpayers are still confused. If you have a question, it is best to call upon one of the staff members at the office than not to call as a delay in payment can be more expensive for the taxpayer. Once again, a schedule of payments is included in your mailing of the tax bills as a reminder, which was:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2017 Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2016

- \Rightarrow First Quarter **due August 1, 2016**
- ⇒ Second Quarter **due November 2**, **2016**

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 30, 2015

- \Rightarrow Third Quarter due February 1, 2017
- \Rightarrow Fourth Quarter **due May 3**, 2017

Any change in ownership, mailing address or anything that needs to be changed on your bill should be addressed immediately with the Assessor's office. The amount of returned mail for various reasons is incredible and we do our best to try to find the correct destination, but the staff does not have a lot of time to devote to this issue. There are several billings that go out for motor vehicles and sewer rental that need to be posted along with the normal duties, leaving very little time to do "catch up". The taxpayers expect a lot of the staff and we have tried to be most accommodating; however, the time restraint placed on the staff with the quarterly billing process leaves little time to be so accommodating.


Getting to Know LGBTQ Families: A Program & Discussion Oct. 27, 4-to 6 p.m. RSVP-Free

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

- 1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
- 2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
- 3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
- 4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

 <u>The Emergency Survival Kit</u> Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours. Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.) 	 <u>Remember</u>, in the event of a severe storm: Secure all outdoor objects. Stay away from windows. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!
 One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months. A basic first aid kit. Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries. WBZ 1030 AM is the alternate station.
