### From the Town Manager

Dear Reader:

The Department of Public Works' winter storm protocol was effective during Winter Storm Helena the weekend of January 7<sup>th</sup>. The DPW team's efforts along with increased communication provided a well-orchestrated response to the over a foot of snow we received. Our thanks to the DPW crews and contractors who provided storm response.

We kicked off the formal budget preparation process with a presentation on the financial condition of the town at a joint meeting of the Town Council and School Committee on January 19<sup>th</sup>. The winter months are when town staff prepares the Capital Budget and the Operating Budget for presentation to the Town Council in March and May, respectively.

There is more information in this newsletter about the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and the 10-Year Financial Forecast.

Barnstable has again received the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award. The award demonstrates the commitment of the Town's governing body and staff to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. I am proud of our budget team and finance department for getting this national recognition.

### Town Clerk's office

When you receive your census form please look it over, make any changes necessary and send it back to this office. You can mail it, or drop it off in our office. **Even if there are no changes we need you to sign the form and send it back to us.** This will make your voting easier this year and keep you up to date on the Voter Registration System.

This form must be completed by all residents (not just citizens or voters) residing in the Town of Barnstable. This is in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.


You can't register to vote on the form. If you wish to register to vote or make any other changes to your voter status, you can register on line at [www.sec.state.ma.us](http://www.sec.state.ma.us), or pick up a mail in form at any of our local libraries or at the Town Clerk's Office. You will receive a confirmation letter once your change in voter status is complete.

This year we will have our Town Election on November 7, 2017. We will have more about the Town Election in the next edition of the Barnstable Bulletin.



### **2017 Parking Permits/Beach Stickers**

We are pleased to announce that 2017 Parking Permits are now available through our mail-in process. For those of you that supplied Barnstable Recreation with your e-mail address, you should be receiving your application via e-mail. If you do not receive it, or did not supply an e-mail address, applications may be downloaded from our website at [www.town.barnstable.ma.us](http://www.town.barnstable.ma.us) under the Recreation Division link. In order to reduce our postage costs, we will not be sending out applications via the postal system. If you do not have access to a printer and need an application mailed to you, please feel free to submit your request in writing to:

**Please include a self-addressed stamped envelope so we can mail the application to you.**

#### **Types of permits and fees:**

**Resident:** \$40 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Landlord:** \$300 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and private). Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

**Seasonal:** \$250 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to **public beaches only.**

**Weekly:** \$70 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into **public beaches only.**

**Replacement:** \$5. This permit is offered at a reduced rate should you sell your vehicle or install a new windshield **after** purchasing your initial permit. **You must present your original permit to receive the reduced rate.**

**Handicap:** \$15 per permit (limit of two per household). Available to resident and/or taxpayer handicap individuals who have a valid driver's license and own a vehicle registered in **their** name.

### Town of Barnstable's FY2016 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) Issued

The Town of Barnstable's fiscal year ending June 30, 2016 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) has been issued and is available on the town's website at [FY16 CAFR](#) . The CAFR contains three main sections; Introductory Section, Financial Section and Statistical Section. The CAFR includes the independent auditor's opinion on the town's financial statements and can be found on page 17 of the document. The auditors expressed an unmodified opinion, or a "clean" opinion, on the statements. The most effective way for an individual to review the CAFR would be to read the Letter of Transmittal and Management's Discussion and Analysis to gain a better understanding of the meaning behind the numbers presented in the document. Ten year historical information is included in the Statistical Section which some individuals may find interesting. The CAFR will be submitted for the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting award issued by the Government Finance Officers Association as in years past. The town has achieved this award for the past 14 CAFR's and anticipates this CAFR to qualify.

### **A Note from the Town Collector**

The FY2017 Actual Real Estate bill for the third quarter is due on February 1, 2017.

### **Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2017**

**Preliminary** Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2016

- √ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2016
- √ Second Quarter **due** November 2, 2016

**Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 30, 2016**

- √ **Third Quarter due February 1, 2017**
- √ Fourth Quarter due May 3, 2017

The 2017 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills should be ready to be issued this month. This is the largest commitment issued by the Registry of Motor Vehicles. There are several commitments issued throughout the year. Please do not ignore these bills! If you sold or no longer own the vehicle, you must contact the Assessor's office for filing of an abatement. Unpaid Motor Vehicle Excise bills do not go away! Interest and penalties for unpaid bills add additional monies to the base charge of the bill and can "flag" your license at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

Any request for information regarding amount of monies paid for real estate, personal property and motor vehicle excise taxes for income tax filings must be made in writing to our office. We do not give the information out by telephone due to the number of telephone calls received as we would not get our day to day responsibilities done.

This is a forecast and is not meant as a spending plan. While we are looking ten years out, decisions made locally and at the state level could substantially impact data assumptions projected in the ten year forecast. 
