JANUARY OBSERVATIONS FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

Happy New Year to all of you from all of us at the Town Clerk's office! We hope you and yours had a wonderful holiday and this year brings you good health and much happiness.

We will be mailing out the Census/Voter/Street Listing forms to arrive at your mailing address on or about the first week of January. By responding to the census, you are providing proof of your residency to protect your voting rights. If all the information on your census is correct, simply sign the bottom of the census and send it back to us.

Also, if someone has moved out of your household and is a voter – please give us their address, email or phone number so that we may contact them to obtain verification. We cannot remove a voter without their verification; thus many people stay on the census for four years until we can, by law, remove them. If anyone has been added to your household, just put their information down on one of the blank lines and make all corrections on the form.

You cannot register to vote on the census form. If you have computer access you can go directly to the Secretary of State's website and register on line at www.sec.state.ma.us. Then click on "Elections and Voting" to register to vote; or come in to the Town Clerk's office and spend a few minutes with us as we enter your voter registration into our computer. We are always pleased to see and work with our residents.

For those residents who live here part of the time in Barnstable, and part of the time in a warmer climate, you fill out the census form using the following guidelines:



You are a Town of Barnstable resident if:

- ✓ This is your permanent address;
- ✓ This is where you are registered to vote; and
- ✓ On your Massachusetts drivers license you have a Town of Barnstable address.

A Note from the Town Collector

Happy 2018! We hope it is a happy, healthy and prosperous year for all.

The FY2018 Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were mailed December 29, 2017. The three part billing has the remittance coupon for February 1st and the remittance coupon for May 1st and a Taxpayer's copy.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR FISCAL 2018

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2017
First Quarter due August 1, 2017
Second Quarter due November 1, 2017

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 29, 2017
Third Quarter due February 1, 2018
Fourth Quarter due May 1, 2018

Please check this bill very carefully as this is the Actual tax bill that reflects any change in the tax rates, assessment, betterment/lien and exemptions. If you have any questions regarding the assessment of the property, you should contact the Assessor's office at 508-862-4022 immediately.

A few tips: If you use your own online bill payment system, please take a moment to make sure you have the correct information. **Check should be made payable and sent to: Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601-0040** and NOT the Lockbox Service, which is the address on the return envelope enclosed with your bill. The Lockbox Service processes the payments electronically for us and without an encoded payment coupon, your online check cannot be processed this way. Your check needs to be processed manually. You should always **use the parcel id# as the identifying account number for real estate** as this number does not change each year. If the check is addressed to the Lockbox, it is rejected and mailed back to our office, which causes a delay in the posting of your payment and may make your payment late.

Check www.townofbarnstable.us to explore the option of scheduling your payment online. If you pay with a checking/savings account, the fee is 40 cents. If you use a debit/credit card, there is a percentage based fee of 2.95% of the amount being paid. These fees are not collected by the Town of Barnstable. If you need any assistance with registering to use the online bill payment system, please feel free to contact my office at 508-862-4054.

Superintendent's Corner

Winter Greetings!

The cold, snow-filled, wintery months are upon us. The weather has me dreaming of warmer months and warmer outdoor activities like baseball, softball, soccer, field hockey, and lacrosse. Barnstable High School students play and excel in these sports on the fields at the high school. I have watched games being played on our fields and had similar thoughts that some of our parents have expressed, "Our students deserve to play on higher quality fields."

A master field improvement plan is not a new idea. A few years ago, Facilities Director David Kanyock worked with consultants to draw up plans for a "Field of Dreams" and a School Committee Workshop was held to discuss the matter. The plan was well received, but there was the question of where the money for the field improvements would come from. The conversation on the plans began to slow down.

Then this past summer, I put together a Master Field Plan Ad Hoc Committee to discuss a plan for field improvements. This came about from parents concerned about the condition of the fields. The Committee consists of school staff and community members that want to see this master field plan become a reality. The Committee has met several times over the past 6 months to discuss renderings of the field plan and the plan to finance the project. The School Department has made this project its top priority with the Town's Capital Improvement Projects for FY'19.

On January 31st, the School Committee will hold a Workshop on the plans in the Barnstable Intermediate School library at 7:00 PM that the public is welcomed to attend.

I hope you enjoy the next few months of winter on Cape Cod (though I am hoping it only snows on the weekends to avoid school snow days). I am looking forward to the warmer weather and outdoor sports (that will hopefully be played on improved fields at the high school).



TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2014-108 MARSTONS MILLS FISH RUN

Description of Project

In accordance with the Town's General Ordinances, Chapter 86-1, specific appropriations will revert back to the General fund after a 3 year period if the funds remain unencumbered by contractual obligations. Chapter 86-4 of the ordinances allows the Town Council to extend the life of the specific appropriation. The project consists of replacing the existing fishway structure that is constructed with a variety of materials, including plywood. It is proposed to remove the existing materials and replace them with a standardized wood structure for the entire 1,100 foot run. The construction will create minimal disturbance to the immediate surroundings, as excavation for and construction of, the new fishway will be done within a confined space by means of a prefabricated trench box.



The Snowy Owls Are Back!

Just before Thanksgiving, Sandy Neck staff observed 5 different snowy owls moving in throughout the park. Barrier beaches like Sandy Neck are regular hotspots for snowy owls during the winter months, due to the habitat similarities of the tundra which the owls are used to further north. If you decide to brave the elements and adventure out to catch a glimpse of this majestic creature in the wild, please keep the following in mind:

- While hiking out on Sandy Neck, you must stay on the front beach and marked trails only! Going off-trail or through the dunes for any reason other than what is written in the rules and regulations is prohibited.
- Feeding, harassing, or disturbing wildlife of any kind on Sandy Neck is prohibited. If a snowy owl can see you or flies away as you approach, you are too close!

While a chance to observe a beautiful creature like the Snowy Owl can be a rewarding and gratifying experience, it is important that we also respect these animals and allow them the space and protection they need in order for a chance to thrive during such a harsh time of year. By protecting our natural resources and all wildlife within, we can continue to provide these views and experiences for future generations to come.
