September - Autumn Annotations from the Town Clerk

By the time you see this information we will be experiencing the crisp nights of fall in the air. The Clerk's Office has another sign of fall...that's when we begin to prepare for elections.

The nomination season for elected town positions has passed. Preliminary Elections were removed from the Town Charter thus our **Town Election is scheduled for November 5, 2019**. The last day to register to vote or make any changes to your voter registration (for instance, if you recently moved) is October 16. On that day the Town Clerk's office will be open until 8:00 PM for any registration issues.

The following individuals will be on all ballots in the town: School Committee Members: (three seats available) Michael Judge, Kathleen Bent, and Joseph Nystrom. Running for two seats on the Housing Authority is incumbent: Deborah Converse, no one took nomination papers for the second seat.

The following odd numbered precincts will have Town Council seats up for election; there are contests in four of the precincts:

All 13 polling locations will be open from 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM on November 5th for voting. All the candidates need you to vote! So please mark your calendar to vote on Tuesday, November 5th because your vote is your voice!

We hope to have the Absentee ballots by the first week in October. If you are planning on going south in the fall and will not be here for the November 5, 2019 election, please call 508-862-4044 to see if the ballots are in so that you may come to the Clerk's Office and vote before you leave.

JOIN THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE **BEACH CLEANUPS!**

While the summertime beach season is winding down, Barnstable is gearing up for **COASTSWEEP 2019** at local beaches. The main cleanup will take place on Sunday, September 22, 9 AM – noon at Sandy Neck Beach Park. Other cleanups will take place at various locations throughout September.

Sponsored by the Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone Management, thousands of COASTSWEEP volunteers remove debris that would otherwise pollute our oceans, beaches, lakes, and rivers. Participants collect bags of trash and debris, and record their findings onto data cards. The data is sent to the Ocean Conservancy and entered into a massive marine debris database. This information is then analyzed and used to identify the sources of marine debris, which helps to prevent the problem in the future.

TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2018-083 NEW WELL EXPLORATION PROGRAM

Description: To continue the on-going new well exploration program with the permitting, designing and construction of new wells for the Hyannis Water System. This capital request is for the third of four phases of the new well exploration program. The first phase consisted of exploratory test wells, environmental notifications, evaluations and recommendations. The second phase dealt with DEP new source approvals, test well construction, and 5 day pumping tests. This third phase will consist of the design and permitting of the new well buildings and appurtenances with all environmental impact reporting requirements. The fourth phase will be the construction phase. A project engineer, partially funded out of this program, will provide a project management and oversight.

The Town has completed the 2018 program year for the Community Development Block Grant program and is preparing Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report (CAPER) for the period July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019. The Town was awarded \$287,173 in

federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to address the goals and objectives of the Town of Barnstable Consolidated Plan for 2015 – 2019. The CAPER is a year-end report that outlines the accomplishments of the Town's CDBG program and is available for review and comment before the Town submits it to HUD for approval.


