### 10.Report of Special Committees

Noise Report (July, October, January, April)

o Christina Lounsbury reviewed the quarterly report of July, August, and September 2021. There were a total of 44 complaints made by 21 complainants. She reviewed the areas from which the complaints were originating.



o Ms. Lounsbury noted that calls increased and most were about flights during the voluntary quiet hours. We are a public use airport and we are open 24/7 so these are voluntary guidelines.

o Military do use the airport for training practices, this was discussed.

o Ms. Lounsbury commented that one complainant has the perspective that flights during the quiet hours are a violation and requested extensive information. Her response to provide all of the information assisted with educating the individual that these are voluntary quiet hours and by law the Airport cannot close its facility to flights during these hours.

Ms. Lounsbury left the meeting at 4:13 pm.

### **Old Business:**

COM0921-04 - Approval of the FY2022 Business Plan Goals and Objectives

MOTION to approve the Fiscal Year 2022 Business Plan Goals and Objectives to include measurable elements for each task and modifications as suggested by the Airport Commission. SPONSOR: Infrastructure & Marketing Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner Flores. Management made modifications to the plan as suggested which included prioritizing the FY2022 initiatives into sound and realistically achievable goals that can be accomplished within the FY2022 window. Measurable elements were added to each one and updates will be provided to the Commission monthly.

There are 110 tasks that the airport wishes to address in the FY2022 window. They span all four goals of the business plan.

Manager Servis reviewed the power point outlining the status of each task as of October 18, 2021 (attached).

Behind Schedule (4 tasks):

o Objective: Identify and Create Corporate Aviation Opportunities

- 3 Tasks: Three step process to evaluate what other airports have done to attract business.
- Objective: Engage Airlines to Develop Partnerships for the Cape and Island Market (Coordinate with airlines)

- The top nine priorities for Fiscal Year 2022 were outlined:

Management would also like to host a future workshop with the Commission to discuss the next tier of priorities and the overall plan in advance of FY2023 development. The Airport has a unique opportunity here where some of the priorities may move up as we consider the use of CARES funding to meet long-term goals or unique opportunities.

Manager Servis reviewed the key details for each of the top priorities and the next

steps for the Business Plan.

Claudine LeBlanc, Creating Marketing Results, will be joining the November meeting to present event and sponsorship possibilities.

There was a discussion of Airline Conferences and the structure of attracting new

service.

A focus on increased daily flights, usability of the airport, and the ability to fill the seats of new airlines was discussed; as well as marketing to non-airline entities. For the 600 daily travelers utilizing bus services, the airport is not currently a viable alternative. The service does not compare to Boston and Providence. The length of the runways does not accommodate many airline fleets. JetBlue is changing their fleet to larger aircraft. A future workshop will be scheduled to discuss marketing focuses.

### **New Business:**

COM1021-1 Approval of the Non-Federal Reimbursable Agreement by and Between the Department of Transportation Federal Aviation Administration and Cape Cod **Gateway Commission** 

MOTION to approve the 5 year Non-Federal Reimbursable Agreement by and between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and the Department of Transportation Federal Aviation Administration to operate and maintain the communications systems in the Air Traffic Control Tower for fiscal years 2022 through 2026. SPONSOR: Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by

Commissioner Weill.

When the HYA Air Traffic Control Tower was constructed, it was done so at 100% federal funding. However, the building itself is under control of the airport and that includes all

maintenance and repair.

As part of the overall arrangement, an agreement exists between the FAA and the Airport to operate and maintain the communications systems for the facility. This Agreement provides funding for the FAA to establish these services. The Agreement is titled: Reimbursable, (HYA) Provide Maintenance for the Hyannis Communications Equipment for FY22- FY26 at Cape Cod Gateway Airport.

The FAA will perform required monthly, quarterly, semi-annual and annual maintenance, flight inspection and documentation as necessary for various communications equipment outlined in the agreement such as radios, transmitters, headsets,

This control tower is contracted out to a non-federal agency to man the tower.



- The agreement identifies labor hours based on estimation for monthly, quarterly, semiannual and annual maintenance, flight inspection and documentation.
- The cost estimates contained in the Agreement are expected to be the maximum costs associated with this Agreement, but may be amended to recover the FAA's actual costs. If during the course of this Agreement actual costs are expected to exceed the estimated costs, the FAA will notify the Airport and an amendment to the Agreement will be executed.
- This agreement does not include the cost of replacement for any of these systems. This
  is strictly a maintenance agreement. Replacement of any of the communications
  systems would be at an additional cost, in which the airport sets aside funding annually
  (\$10,000) for such replacement if needed
- The cost of the Agreement is as follows:
  - o FY22 = \$13,665.00
  - o FY23 = \$13,873.50
  - o FY24 = \$14,092.43
  - o FY25 = \$14,300.93
  - o FY26 = \$14,530.28
  - o Total FY22-26 = \$70,462.14
- The Airport typically prepays the entire estimated cost of the Agreement prior to the start of each fiscal year.
  - o The advance payment will be held as a non-interest bearing deposit.

COM1021-2 Approval of the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Jet Fuel Discount Program MOTION to approve the revised Cape Cod Gateway Airport Jet Fuel Discount Program effective October 19, 2021. SPONSOR: Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

- This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner DiGeorge.
- The Airport Jet Fuel Discount Program has been in existence since 2012 and changes have been made to the program over the years to incorporate additional features, to modify tier levels and to ensure that the airport offered a fair and reasonable discount to entice participation.
- Modifications were made in 2015, 2017, 2020 and now in 2021
- The 2020 version reduced the number of tiers, with tier 1 starting at 100,001 gallons due to lack of participation below that mark.
- Currently Netjets and Everest are the two largest participators in our program with Everest well surpassing Netjets
- The programs were designed to include an annual contract with a fuel quota (Gold Program), an annual contract without the fuel quota (Silver Program) plus an annual contract without the fuel quota – loyalty program (Bronze Program)
- The discounts were modified with the Gold Program receiving the greatest discount (more risk for Fuel Purchaser) and Silver and Bronze still receiving a discount but at a lesser rate than the Gold.
- In the previous program the Airport identified the **cost per gallon Margin** that the Fuel Purchasers would pay under a discount program. In this version the Airport eliminated that and only identifies the cost savings per gallon (\$0.60 or \$0.30/gallon savings versus the Margin they would pay).
  - o This approach still allows for a significant discount for the Fuel Purchaser but gives us flexibility to adjust our Margin with demand, season, and etc.

COM1021-3 Approval of the Jet Fuel Pricing Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Everest Fuel Management, LLC

**MOTION** to approve the one-year Jet Fuel Pricing Agreement by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Everest Fuel Management, LLC effective October 19, 2021. **SPONSOR:** Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner Bailey.

Everest Fuel Management has contracted with the Airport since 2017.

- Their initial contract in 2017 started at 50,001 gallons of jet fuel (the "Fuel Quota")
- In 2018 they increased that to 100,001 gallons of jet fuel (the "Fuel Quota")
- In 2019/2020, the raised their purchase to 200,001 gallons of jet fuel (the "Fuel Quota")

Each year they surpassed their Fuel Quota.

In 2021 they raised their purchase to 400,001 gallons of jet fuel (the "Fuel Quota").
 They actually purchased 567,327 gallons of jet fuel.

This year they wanted to maintain the 400,001 gallon minimum purchase tier.

COM1021-4 Approval of the License Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Heritage Turbines

**MOTION** to approve the one-year \$1,500.00 Aviation Related Off-Airport Access and Land Use License Agreement by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Heritage Turbines, Inc. Effective November 1, 2021. **SPONSOR:** Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner Weill.

 This is the third year that the airport has held a License Agreement with Heritage Turbines for the right to access Airport property for the purposes of loading and offloading equipment.

The loading dock abuts Airport property within an existing parking lot located behind

the Heritage Turbine facilities.

The Airport currently charges \$1500/access agreement.

 Management will be looking to increase such fees with the FY2022 Airport Rates and Charges modifications. This was also discussed with the Finance Subcommittee.

COM1021-5 Approval of the License Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and New England Aircraft Detailing

**MOTION** to approve the one-year \$1,500.00 Aviation Related Off-Airport Access and Land Use License Agreement by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and New England Aircraft Detailing effective November 1, 2021. **SPONSOR:** Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

- This is the third year that the airport has held a License Agreement with New England Aircraft Detailing for the right to access Airport property for the purposes of washing aircraft.
- New England Aircraft Detailing enters the airport property to dry wash aircraft for various tenants.

The Airport currently charges \$1500/access agreement.

- Management will be looking to increase such fees with the FY2022 Airport Rates and Charges modifications. This was also discussed with the Finance Subcommittee.
- Commissioner Bierwirth suggested marketing this firm to transient aircraft to have interiors cleaned. She would like to discuss at a future meeting.

### COM1021-6 Review and Discuss the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for FY2023-FY2027 for Cape Cod Gateway Airport

**MOTION** to approve the 5 year projected Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the FY2023-FY2027 for the Cape Cod Gateway Airport. **SPONSOR:** Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner Weill.

 As discussed in the August meetings, a draft CIP was provided to the Finance Subcommittee and the Commission in anticipation of the future meeting with the State and Federal agencies to make sure that the Commission was on the same page as Airport Management regarding various future projects.

Airport Management met with the State and Federal agencies on Monday September

 The projects listed in the various years FY2023-FY2027 remained as is in the DRAFT CIP with no further changes made in the year in which the projects are planned for implementation.

The only modifications made were to update some of the cost estimates.

 The runway extension, which is part of the Airport Master Plan, is in the CIP to be implemented in2027 after FAA required taxiway changes are completed.

 The Town of Barnstable Finance Department has received this CIP and it will be presented to the Town Council in November.

### COM1021-7 Review and Discuss Federal Airport Grants & Status

**MOTION** to approve the Federal Airport Grants and the use of the CARES Act grant to fund the remodel of the Fixed Base Operation and renovations to the building. **SPONSOR:** Management (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner Weill.

 There are three existing projects under the CARES Act Grant that have been approved by the Commission to move forward. These are the T-Hangar project, Replacement of the Fleet Hangar Doors, and the extension of Mary Dunn Way.

 The fourth project, remodel of the Airport's Fixed Based Operation and renovations, was requested to be funded with CARES Act funds by the Commission.

 The Marketing and Infrastructure Subcommittee asked that this project be of the highest priority and implemented ASAP using CARES Act funds. With the events that



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are scheduled for FY2022, and response to pilot's needs, the building's interior space needs a facelift and safety protocols implemented to place the door in the appropriate location.

Initially the Marketing and Infrastructure Subcommittee wanted a quick fix; new floors, paint, furniture, etc. Management consulted with Fennick McCredie Architecture to see

if this was possible.

Cost estimates for renovation were \$180,000 but this included a \$100,000 door, new

entrance and vestibule. It did not include restroom renovations.

In speaking to Fennick McCredie Architecture about the remodeling effort they indicated that the "quick fix" versus "full implementation" as originally planned with the new door would not be viable.

Based on accessibility law, the pilot space cannot be modified without upgrading and updating the restrooms to meet accessibility requirements/code due to regulations that require review of several factors when determining if the requirement to meet various building codes.

COM1021-9 Approval of the Ross Aviation Electric Vehicle Charging Station **Development and Site Host Agreement** 

MOTION to approve the Electric Vehicle Make Ready Program Site License Agreement by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and NSTAR Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy effective October 19, 2021 for the Ross Aviation Electric Vehicle Charging Station Development. NSTAR provided a modified Site Host agreement to better align with the airport's needs and so that development and installation of the EV stations can proceed forward.

Modifications were suggested by Airport Management within the agreement and

Approval of the Site Host Agreement will allow Ross Aviation to proceed forward to development. The Airport will coordinate with both entities during the construction process and will require liability insurance from NSTAR.

### COM1021-10 Approval of Ross Aviation Sign Plan

 On August 18, 2021, Taryn Wilson of Sign Dealz reached out to the Airport regarding Signage Submittals for Ross Aviation located at 730 Barnstable Rd., Hyannis, MA 02601.

- Ross Aviation is in the process of modifying all Rectrix signage to matched the revised company name, logo and branding for Ross Aviation.
- There are five (5) signs total that need to be upgraded.

o Of the five (5) signs...

 One (1) is LED illuminated and mostly acrylic (this is the one on the secure side of the building facing the ramp)

All other signs are aluminum with 3M vinyl lettering and/or graphics

They were asked to provide the following in order to make this leasehold improvement:

 Detailed construction plans/engineering drawings for each sign must be submitted to Airport Management electronically.

o Obtain all permits from local sources such as electrical work for the lighted sign

to be issued by the Town of Barnstable.

o Liability Insurance listing the Airport additionally insured prior to construction

Sign Dealz provided the following:

 Signage Drawings along with Engineering for Ross Aviation Signage (HYA) at the Cape Cod Gateway Airport.

The sign at the Mary Dunn Way entrance will be removed as part of the Sign Plan.

### COM1021-11 Approval of the Sign Plan Modifications for Airport Access Road to Meet Rebranding Efforts

**MOTION** to approve the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Sign Plan Modifications for the Airport Access Road to meet the rebranding efforts. **SPONSOR:** Infrastructure & Marketing Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

 This agenda item was moved and read by Chairman Griffin and seconded by Commissioner DiGeorge.

The airport has been working to obtain quotes to replace the following:

- Terminal building sign,
- Wooden airport signs,
- Existing airport access road signs, and

Highway signs.

For FY2022, we have set aside \$50,000 for this task assuming that this will be Phase I
of the plan.

Terminal Sign Replacement

- o The terminal sign will be replaced with our new logo, font and colors for less than \$7,000 as the lowest quote from Plymouth Sign Company. Management would like approval to move forward to get this replaced as soon as possible.
- Existing airport access road signs



- We have 27 blue airport access road signs in which we will investigate which needs to be modified.
- We intend on reskinning these signs and maintaining the current locations.

There may be a few signs in which we relocate.

 We will also investigate lighting some of the signs with solar lighting as many have commented on their difficulty to see at night.

Staff will work with the Procurement Office to obtain quotes.

The Wooden signs

We have two wooden signs, one at Attucks Lane and one at the Airport Rotary.
 In 2011 each sign cost ~\$8,000 to create so with inflation, these signs could cost somewhere in the realm of \$15,000 per sign.

We would like to maintain wooden signs and will need to work with a sign maker

to redesign each.

Highway signs.

 We have 22 green and white MaSSDOT Highway signs, of those only 4-5 need to include the new name on the sign

o McFarland Johnson is working on correcting these with Mass DOT Aeronautics

 Commissioners made suggestions for the wooden signs and would like to see some other renderings and relocation of the rotary sign to a better visual area.

 The name change for the airport has received positive feedback from pilots, and mixed reviews from the community as they associate with, and wanted Barnstable still, but they understood that the Airport services all of Cape Cod.

The GOOGLE name change is being worked on, but the verification process is lengthy. All of the FAA documentation has been modified. The airport identifier is still HYA.

### **Updates:**

o A&P School

o Manager Servis has been communicating with the National Aviation Academy for several months and hopes to host Russ Cephas (Vice President of Operations) and Holli K. Hudson (Chief Strategy Officer (CSO) & Senior Executive Vice President) on an airfield tour. They seem eager to establish a satellite school at the Cape Cod Gateway Airport.

o In the past, conversations with the Cape Cod Community College (CCCC), they have not expressed a desire to establish a satellite school at HYA. Manager Servis attended a breakfast and tour of the Plymouth facility and learned that the program has greatly expanded to the point that they are now offering night courses. They went from 25 students/semester to the ability to accommodate 50 and still have enrollees on a wait list for fall and spring semesters.

In speaking with the new CCCC Director of the AMT Program, Michael Sasso, they now have a desire and the ability to develop a satellite school. They would like to see the possibility of a dual enrollment course at Barnstable HS and/or other

schools on the cape with a facility at HYA in the future

Management would like to host a future Business Plan workshop with the Commission to discuss the next tier of priorities.

This is a very unique opportunity where some of the Business Plan priorities may move up as we consider the use of CARES funding to meet long-term goals/unique opportunities.

The Commission is in full support of moving forward to bring this to fruition.

- Regulation requires that the following evaluation is used to analyze the building code requirements:
  - The building is assessed between \$1M \$3M
  - o Public spaces in building (entry & lobby, WC if provided for public) = 5% of building area.
  - Assessed value of public spaces = \$150k.
  - 30% of that is \$45k.
  - o The recent roof upgrade (\$592,334.25) counts towards the % and analysis so the 30% Rule triggers full accessibility upgrades for public spaces.

### F1021-1 Review and Discuss the Non-Federal Reimbursable Agreement by and Between the Department of Transportation Federal Aviation Administration and Cape Cod Gateway Commission.

- When the HYA Air Traffic Control Tower was constructed, it was done so at 100% federal funding.
- The building is under control of the airport and that includes all maintenance and repair.
- The Airport to operate and maintain the communications systems for the facility. This Agreement provides funding for the FAA to establish these services.
- This is strictly a maintenance agreement. Replacement of any of the communications systems would be at an additional cost, in which the airport sets aside funding annually (\$10,000) for such replacement if needed.
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.

### F1021-2 Review and Discuss the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Jet Fuel Discount Program

- The Airport Jet Fuel Discount Program has been in existence since 2012 and changes have been made to the program over the years to incorporate additional features, to modify tier levels and to ensure that the airport offered a fair and reasonable discount to entice participation.
- The programs were designed to include an annual contract with a fuel quota and annual contract without the fuel quota.
- Manager Servis stated we are in alignment with other airports and the new fuel agreement we have the flexibility to increase our margin to be competitive to surrounding airports.
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.

### F1021-3 Review and Discuss the Jet Fuel Pricing Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Everest Fuel Management, LLC.

- Everest Fuel Management has contracted with the Airport since 2017 and each year they surpassed their Fuel Quota.
- In 2021 they raised their purchase to 400,001 gallons of jet fuel
- Manager Servis stated Everest has already agreed to sign agreement
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.

### F1021-4 Review and Discuss the License Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Heritage Turbines.

- This is the third year that the airport has held a License Agreement with Heritage Turbines for the right to access Airport property for the purposes of loading and unloading equipment
- The loading dock abuts Airport property within an existing parking lot located behind the Heritage Turbine facilities
- The Airport currently charges \$1500/access agreement
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.

### F1021-5 Review and Discuss the License Agreement by and Between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and New England Aircraft Detailing

- This is the third year that the airport has held a License Agreement with New England Aircraft Detailing for the right to access Airport property for the purposes of washing aircraft
- New England Aircraft Detailing enters the airport property to dry wash aircraft for various tenants
- The Airport currently charges \$1500/access agreement
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.

### F1021-6 Review and Discuss the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for FY2023-FY2027 for Cape Cod Gateway Airport

- Manager Servis reviewed FY2023 –FY2027 CIP Presentation
- Airport Management met with the State and Federal agencies on Monday September 27, 2021.
- There are no changes in the year in which the projects are planned for implementation.
- The only modifications made were to update some of the cost estimates, and change to the Easements runway protection zone.
- The agenda item was moved to the October 19th, 2021 Full Commission meeting for approval.



Effective on the date above, the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Commission has revised the jet fuel discount program dated February 18, 2020 as outlined below and shown on the attached pricing schedules.

The regular retail price of jet fuel at Cape Cod Gateway Airport ("Fuel Seller") is based upon the PLATTS New York Harbor Jet Barge Mean Previous Week wholesale price, plus the cost differential and transportation costs billed by Fuel Seller's fuel supplier, plus applicable Federal taxes and Fuel Seller handling costs, to determine Fuel Seller's "cost of fuel." The Fuel Seller adds a margin per gallon to all fuel to arrive at a retail price, adjusted on a weekly basis. The margin is the amount between the selling price of fuel and the cost of fuel. The margin is calculated internally based on demand for fuel and the Fuel Seller's cost of doing business, which includes all fees associated with the Fueling Cost Center such as staff salaries, necessary staff training to meet federal fuel delivery safety standards, fuel truck leases and maintenance, fuel truck insurance, hazardous materials transport and pollution insurance, and other overhead associated with the Fueling Cost Center. This margin is adjusted on a weekly basis.

Discounts will be offered to those under contract to purchase jet fuel from the Fuel Seller. As shown in the pricing noted below, the "Discount Rate" will be provided to purchasers of jet fuel ("Fuel Purchaser") under contract ("Fuel Agreement").

Discounts will be offered to those under Fuel Agreement. The term of the Fuel Agreement is twelve (12) months from the date the Fuel Agreement is signed, the ("Effective Date") and will terminate on the twelve (12) month anniversary of the Effective Date.



Discounts for Fuel Purchaser under a Fuel Agreement to purchase jet fuel from the Fuel Seller will be available to purchasers who own or operate an aircraft, or manage aircraft (or fleets of aircraft) under FAR Parts 91K, 121, and 135. Supporting documentation will be required.

In order to qualify for the various discount programs, participants must either:

- a. Utilize a 0% transaction charge credit card, such as the Philips card, or other Fuel Seller approved credit card; or
- b. Prepay the Fuel Seller sufficient funds to cover anticipated fuel purchases; or
- c. Prior agreed upon fuel purchases would be billed under a Net 10 payment plan.

See notes for each program below and Attachment A for credit and payment terms.

There are three (3) types of discounts now available under a contractual basis with the Fuel Seller. Fuel Purchasers must enter into Fuel Agreement with the Fuel Seller to qualify.

- I. GOLD PROGRAM Multiple Cumulative Purchases WITH an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement:
  - a. Discounted prices are available from gallon one (1) if the Fuel Purchaser enters into an annual contract for Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement and is based upon the amount contracted ("Fuel Quota"). Additional discounts beyond the contracted amount are available upon reaching each successive tier level over the contracted amount stated in the Fuel Agreement – the more fuel purchased, the higher the Discount Rate.
  - b. It is up to the Fuel Purchaser to notify the Fuel Seller when more than the Fuel Quota has been reached and upon reaching each successive tier level over the contracted Fuel Agreement amount. The Fuel Purchaser is to notify the Fuel Seller via the general email <a href="https://hya.com">hya.officemailbox@flyhya.com</a>.



- c. See Schedule A GOLD PROGRAM (below) for multiple cumulative purchases, using the Airport payment and credit terms.
- d. Example: For a Fuel Pricing Agreement with a Fuel Quota in the amount of 300,000 gallons, the Discount Rate from gallon one (1) would be \$0.75 per gallon. If the Fuel Purchaser actually purchased over 300,001 gallons, the Discount Rate would change to \$0.90 per gallon for all fuel purchased over 300,001 gallons.
- e. Note that any waiver of Ramp Fees must be in alignment with the Airport's published rates and charges. There is NO waiver of Airport imposed landing fees.
- f. Any aircraft wishing to participate in this program must have a prior written approved Fuel Agreement from the Fuel Seller; and for based or fleets of aircraft they must provide a list of eligible aircraft tail numbers in advance of purchases and provide a specific fuel release for each purchase.
- g. If Fuel Purchaser purchases less than the Fuel Quota from the Fuel Seller during the term of the Fuel Agreement, then Fuel Purchaser shall pay Fuel Seller a penalty ("Fuel Quota Penalty"). The Fuel Quota Penalty would be paid in addition to the previously paid Discount Rate for each gallon of fuel purchased during the term of this Agreement, a lump sum payment at the end of the term to account for the shortfall in fuel purchases. The Fuel Quota Penalty shall be calculated as follows:

#### Where:

Y = Gallons actually purchased by Fuel Purchaser from Fuel Seller during the term of an Agreement

Fuel Quota Penalty Rate = \$2.40/gallon

Fuel Quota Penalty = \$2.40 -the discount price per gallon x (Fuel Quota-Y)



#### Example:

Fuel Quota	=	400,001 gallons
Y	=	350,001 gallons
Fuel Quota Not Met (in gallons)	=	(400,001 – 350,001) = 50,000
Fuel Quota Penalty Rate Per Gallon(1)	=	\$2.40
Discount Price Per Gallon	=	\$1.10
Fuel Quota Penalty	=	\$2.40 - \$1.10 x 50,000
	=	\$65,000

#### Notes:

- (1) The Fuel Seller adds a margin per gallon to all fuel to arrive at a retail price, adjusted on a weekly basis. Because this rate is adjusted on a weekly basis and can therefore fluctuate weekly, the Fuel Quota Penalty has identified this margin as a fixed rate for ease of calculation and known quantity for any penalties implemented.
- h. The Discount Rate would only change when the new tier is reached beyond the Fuel Quota, <u>not</u> back to gallon one.
- II. <u>SILVER PROGRAM Multiple Cumulative Purchases WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement:</u>
  - a. Discounted prices are available and awarded only when the Gallons/Uplift (see Schedule B below - SILVER PROGRAM) is achieved if the Fuel Purchaser enters into an annual contract for Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement. Additional discounts are available upon reaching each successive tier level – the more fuel purchased, the higher the Discount Rate once the tier level is reached.
  - b. It is up to the Fuel Purchaser to notify the Fuel Seller upon reaching each successive tier level. The Fuel Purchaser is to notify the Fuel Seller via the general email <a href="https://doi.org/10.2016/jwya.com">hya.officemailbox@flyhya.com</a>.
  - c. See Schedule B SILVER PROGRAM (below) for multiple cumulative purchases, using the Airport payment and credit terms.
  - d. Example: For a Fuel Pricing Agreement with/out a Fuel Quota, if the Fuel Purchaser purchases 50,000 gallons, no Discount Rate is applied. If the Fuel Purchaser purchases 100,001 gallons within the same contract year, each gallon thereafter and up to 200,000 gallons



purchased is eligible for a \$0.35 discount/gallon, the Discount Rate, (from 100,001 gallons to 200,000 gallons purchased). If the Fuel Purchaser purchases 200,001 gallons within the same contract year, each gallon thereafter and up to 300,000 gallons purchased is eligible for a \$0.50 discount/gallon (from 200,001 gallons to 300,000 gallons purchased) and so on.

- e. The Discount Rate would only change when the new tier is reached and will not apply back to gallon one.
- f. Note that any waiver of Ramp Fees must be in alignment with the Airport's published rates and charges. There is NO waiver of Airport imposed landing fees.
- g. Any aircraft wishing to participate in this program must have a prior written approved Fuel Agreement from the Fuel Seller; and for based or fleets of aircraft they must provide a list of eligible aircraft tail numbers in advance of purchases and provide a specific fuel release for each purchase.
- III. <u>BRONZE PROGRAM Multiple Cumulative Purchases WITH/OUT an</u> Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement ("Loyalty Program"):
  - a. Discounted prices are available and awarded only when the Gallons/Uplift (see Schedule C below - BRONZE PROGRAM) is achieved if the Fuel Purchaser enters into an annual contract for Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement - Loyalty Program.
  - b. It is up to the Fuel Purchaser to enter into an annual contract for Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement - Loyalty Program. The Loyalty Program will be administered in the following manner:
    - i. Year One (initial contract year). Fuel Purchaser must contract under the SILVER PROGRAM - Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement
    - ii. Year Two. Based on Fuel Purchaser's ability to purchase fuel that exceeds the second tier under the SILVER PROGRAM - Multiple Cumulative Purchases – WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement (100,001 gallons of



- fuel purchased), the Discount Price for year Two will be available from gallon one (1).
- iii. See Schedule C BRONZE PROGRAM (below)
- c. It is up to the Fuel Purchaser to notify the Fuel Seller upon reaching each successive tier level over the contracted amount. The Fuel Purchaser is to notify the Fuel Seller via the general email <a href="https://hya.com">hya.officemailbox@flyhya.com</a>.
- d. See Schedule C BRONZE PROGRAM (below) for multiple cumulative purchases, using the Airport payment and credit terms.
- e. Example: Multiple Cumulative Purchases WITH/OUT an Annual Fuel Quota Fuel Agreement Loyalty Program, if the Fuel Purchaser purchases 100,001 gallons of fuel in Year One, the Discount Rate is applied in Year Two of the Fuel Agreement from gallon one (1).
- f. Note that any waiver of Ramp Fees must be in alignment with the Airport's published rates and charges. There is NO waiver of Airport imposed landing fees.
- g. Any aircraft wishing to participate in this program must have a prior written approved Fuel Agreement from the Fuel Seller; and for based or fleets of aircraft they must provide a list of eligible aircraft tail numbers in advance of purchases and provide a specific fuel release for each purchase.

#### Credit and Payment Terms.

Payment by Fuel Purchaser shall be made by check or approved electronic funds transfer, and the terms shall be net ten (10) days subject to credit approval by the Fuel Seller. Past due amounts shall accrue interest at a rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month, or the maximum rate permitted by applicable law, whichever is less. All amounts more than fifteen (15) days past due shall incur an additional five percent (5%) administrative fee. Any waiver by the Fuel Seller of interest charges or administrative fees on a particular invoice shall not be construed as a waiver by the Fuel Seller of its right to impose such charges on other or subsequent iet fuel sales. The Fuel Seller reserves the right to apply Fuel Purchaser's payments to any outstanding invoices or obligations of Fuel Purchaser as determined by the Fuel Seller in its sole discretion, without regard to the aging of any account. Fuel Purchaser shall be liable for all fees and costs, including without limitation attorney's fees, incurred by the Fuel Seller in connection with any collection activities undertaken by the Fuel Seller for the non-payment of any amounts due hereunder by Fuel Purchaser. The Fuel Seller reserves the right to modify or cancel the credit terms provided to the fuel customer at any time, in its sole discretion upon notice to Fuel Purchaser. If the Fuel Seller selects not to extend or cancels any credit terms provided to the Fuel Purchaser, prior to each sale of aviation jet fuel, Fuel Purchaser shall: (a) make a prepayment to Fuel Seller; (b) cause to be issued a letter of credit in favor of the Fuel Seller in a form and in an amount from a bank that is acceptable to the Fuel Seller from time to time in its sole discretion; (c) cause all Fuel Purchaser sales transactions to be by the use of a Fuel Seller approved 0% carrying charge credit card; or (d) give other security to the Fuel Seller in a manner, or a type, in a form and in an amount that is acceptable to the Fuel Seller. The Fuel Seller reserves the right, in addition to all other rights and remedies available to it under the law, in equity or otherwise, to suspend further performance of fuel sales, and demand payment of all outstanding balances, if Fuel Purchaser fails to make any payment as herein provided, or if the Airport at any time deems itself insecure with regard to the creditworthiness or financial condition of the Fuel Purchaser.
