BARNSTABLE DISABILITY COMMISSION MINUTES

June 20, 2012 11:30 a.m.

Barnstable Senior Center, Route 28 Hyannis, MA 02601

ATTENDEES: Linda Cook, Vice Chair, Raye Kaddy, Chair, Sheila Mulcahy, Ann Canedy, Town Councilor/Council Liaison, Tammy Cunningham, Treasurer/Secretary, Pat Andres, Merrill Blum, Ann Mazzola, Marc Grenier, Jean Boyle, and Jim Berks. Also Present: Dick Andres, resident.

Meeting called to order at 11:32 A.M.

Public Comment: Marc Grenier, newly appointed member to the Barnstable Disability Commission, introduced himself. The Commission welcomed Marc to the BDC.

Minutes:

Approval of the minutes of May 16, 2012: Pat Andres moved to approve, Ann Mazzola seconded.

Slate of Officers for 2012 – 2013:

Linda Cook handed out the ballot for the slate of officers. She stated if there were any amendments required the ballots would be amended for the meeting being held in August.

There will be no BDC meeting held in July.

Finance Report:

Tammy Cunningham provided a copy of the current net income statement along with an expenditures spreadsheet. Jean Boyle moved to approve the treasurers report, Merrill Blum seconded.

Access Report:

Jean Boyle commented she has contacted Dan Horn and Roger Parsons to discuss having a handicap ramp built at Millway beach to allow everyone access to the water, however, she has not spoken with them.

Jim Berks replied he does not believe it is doable to build a ramp at that beach. Jean Boyle commented it is the only beach in Barnstable on the Northside. Councilor Canedy agreed with Jim Berks and suggested something else be considered other than a ramp.

Beach Chairs: There are 4 new surf chairs available at various beaches. The chairs go right into the water.

Councilor Canedy stated she spoke at length with Lotti Diomede of Smile.Org. This is a legitimate organization and it is not a quid pro quo arrangement. She stated Smile.Org is trying to get the word out about the chairs and would like to donate the chairs to communities on the Cape. Councilor Canedy stated Ms. Diomede is willing to come speak to the BDC at anytime. If a person makes a donation to Smile.org they will be given a lawn sign. They have donated 20 chairs to 12 towns thus far.

The new chairs from Smile.org cost approximately \$5000 a piece to build and will go into the water. Councilor Canedy stated she writes a weekly newsletter to 715 constituents and will be adding a blurb in her newsletter on the new surf chairs available at Craigville, Covells', Veteran's, and Kalmus.

Port a Potties: A accessible port a potty is on location at Covell's until Labor Day. Loop beach is also going to have a accessible port a potty being delivered June 22nd until after Labor Day.

Lifeguard Training: Lifeguard training/sensitivity training is being held today at the Town Hall hearing room.

Monitor Training Report: Raye Kaddy stated five members attended the two day training being held in Harwich. A lot of great and useful information was provided at the meeting including discussions on the laws.

A discussion was held on ordering materials for assisting in measuring slopes and weighing doors.

Name Change: Councilor Canedy stated she spoke with Town Attorney Ruth Weil about changing the name of the Commission. Attorney Weil stated it will require amending the

Administrative Code and they would like to make all those changes at one time. It has been requested they continue to use the current name until the Administrative Code is amended. No time frame was provided.

A discussion was then held on the by laws. Councilor Canedy asked under what authority the Commission has the ability to create by laws? The Commission replied it is under the laws relating to Commissions which states it is required they have by-laws.

Self Evaluation Forms: Members were asked to return their self evaluation forms. A summary of the comments and results will be provided at the August meeting.

Goal setting Feedback: None

Dining Guide Feedback: Raye Kaddy commented 22 surveys have been completed to date with \$400 being paid out. Raye stated she spoke with Kristin concerning the design of the guide and provided her with a template for the page. \$5000 has been set aside for the project with a total of \$400 expended.

Scholarships: Linda Cooke provided a sheet listing the scholarship recipients awarded to each school. Linda Cooke explained to the Commission the Commission has no part of the decision making process when it comes to awarding the scholarships. Each school is responsible for making that decision. Four scholarships of \$1000 are being given out this year; two at Project Forward – Cape Cod Community College, Barnstable High School, and Sturgis Charter School. The students must be "challenged" either physically or mentally. Sheila Mulcahy moved to approve the scholarship lists provided, Ann Mazzola seconded (list attached).

Councilor Canedy commented she received a very nice certificate of appreciation. Thank you. She added that she spoke with Attorney McLaughlin concerning the matter relating to the placard and plate and both are covered under the Town's ordinance.

Merrill Blum discussed the Stand Down event being held on August 11th. He stated they have partnered with Duffy Health Center to offer this event which will be part clinical and part informational. Merrill stated it will be a very nice event.

June 11th there is an event being held Vets Fishing with Vets. All participating will be fishing off of the Helen H. A cookout will be held after and there is a cost associated with the trip, however, one can ask for assistance if they are unable to afford the fee.

Report on 911: Merrill stated he has had a few discussions with Beth Albert of the County. There are a lot of issues relating to privacy and individuals not wanting to be on the list. Merrill stated there has been a discussion on the need for a universal 911 list for those who may need special services from 911 responders.

Barnstable Disability Commission Achievements 2011 – 2012

- 1. Restructured by-laws brought them into 2012 with anticipation of a name change to "Barnstable Commission on Disability".
- 2. Continued work on the Accessible Dining Main St., Hyannis, by surveying twenty plus of our wonderful local restaurants through a very positive and collaborative endeavor with the Hyannis Main St. BID.
- 3. Awarded four \$1000 scholarships
- 4. Sent advisories and managed complex complaints successfully around issues of access.
- 5. Funded special projects such as a handicap ramp at BWB School, portable, handicap toilets at several beaches, etc.
- 6. Established and recommended some problem solving guidelines
- 7. Worked to influence non-passage of HB2883 with help from Re. Vieira
- 8. Continued with town accessibility surveys of beaches, schools, municipal buildings, and other town structures.
- 9. Worked with town to have curb cuts constructed on West Main St. for Barnstable High School.
- 10. Worked with the Town of Barnstable Recreation Department on accessibility issues.
- 11. Nominated Al Melcher for outstanding work in the field of disabilities and he was honored at the Annual Red Cross Hero's Breakfast
- 12. Five commission members attended a 2 day training entitled the Community Access Monitor Program which prepared us for the new ADA Regs. which recently went into affect. This will allow us to survey more accurately.
