Chair Laurie Young called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm.

Acting under the provisions of the Code of the Town of Barnstable, ss 112-1 through 112-7, the Historical Commission held a Public Hearing on the following applications previously determined significant and referred to Public Hearing:

Applications:

Thomas, Lisa, 31 Parker Road, Osterville, Map 117 Parcel 161, Delton C. Hall House, Built c.1939, Inventoried Addition in the rear/West
Represented by Timothy Luff

Timothy Luff described the project as seeking to complement neighborhood aesthetics and look more historic.

Nancy Shoemaker asked what would be removed and if the addition would be one story, adding that the proposed changes seem to be an improvement on what currently exists.

MOTION I:

Nancy Shoemaker moved, seconded by Elizabeth Mumford, that, after review and consideration of public testimony, the application, and associated materials, the Significant Building at 31 Parker Road, Osterville, Map 117, Parcel 161, is a Preferably-preserved Significant Building.

MOTION II:

Nancy Shoemaker moved, seconded by Chair Laurie Young, that, in accordance with Section 112-3(G), the Barnstable Historical Commission determines that the partial demolition of the Preferably-preserved Significant Building located at 31 Parker Road, Osterville, Map 117, Parcel 161, is not detrimental to the historical, cultural, and architectural heritage or resources of the Town.

Segal, Robert & Sherman, Janice, 1376 Main Street, Cotuit, Map 033 Parcel 024, Morse Barn, Built c.1845, Contributing Structure, National Register Historic District; Inventoried Raise and replace foundation, repair rot and sags in building, remove rear addition, re-shingle. Represented by Ralph Cataldo of Cataldo Builders, & Robert Segal

Chair Laurie Young noted that the home on this property was previously reviewed and restored.

Ralph Cataldo reminded of his previous informal meeting to discuss possibilities with the Commission in March 2017, saying he took the advice offered then and applied it to his plan to lift the barn, build a new foundation, and reshingle.

Nancy Shoemaker sought confirmation that the plan is to replace the foundation and demolish a small section on the rear of the barn.

George Jessop asked if the arch windows will be removed, and Mr. Cataldo replied that they will be removed to provide needed egress.

- The actions proposed constitute a substantial alteration that would jeopardize the historic structure's status as a
 Contributing Structure in a National Register Historic District as defined in § 3 of the Cape Cod Commission
 Development of Regional Impact Review Threshold;

The Barnstable Historical Commission further finds and determines that in exceeding these threshold criteria the project is subject to a mandatory referral to the Cape Cod Commission as a Development of Regional Impact.

Elizabeth Mumford moved, seconded by George Jessop, that in accordance with Section 112-3(G), the Barnstable Historical Commission determines that the partial demolition of the Preferably-preserved Significant Building located at 1376 Main Street, Cotuit, Map 033 Parcel 024, is not detrimental to the historical, cultural, and architectural heritage or resources of the Town.

8 East Bay Realty Trust, 8 East Bay Road, Osterville, Map 141 Parcel 105, Captain George Lovell House, Built 1826, National Register of Historic Places, State Register of Historic Places, Inventoried Demolish and replace additions, add garage, add rear porch, remove rear door.

Represented by Attorney Sarah Torano-Flores & Architect Michael McClung

Atty. Torano-Flores explained that she had met with Sarah Korjeff of the Cape Cod Commission, as well as Elizabeth Jenkins of the Town of Barnstable Planning & Development Department, to get feedback on moving forward with the renovations in preparation for today's hearing.

Chair Laurie Young noted that she is familiar with this property, calling it a significant property in Osterville that has needed renovation for quite some time. Marilyn Fifield noted that a previous Historical Commission Chair had once owned the property.

Architect McClung detailed the proposed project, including plans to replace all wiring, insulation and plumbing, but said that lifting the structure for a new foundation is not planned, unless it is found to be necessary in the course of renovations. Nancy Shoemaker asked if the possible foundation replacement plan is included in the application, and Mr. McClung confirmed that it is. She also asked the dates of the two wing additions, and he replied that he is not

sure when they were built, but he is certain that they were not part of the original structure. Also, he said none of the windows in the additions date to the original structure.

In discussing the roof pitch, Mr. McClung said that the Cape Cod Commission staff had recommended keeping the current roof lines as they are to preserve the historic essence of the structure, and he noted that he had found Commission staff comments valuable.

Nancy Shoemaker asked if the windows in the front would be retained and if the front columns would be repaired or replaced, and Mr. McClung replied that the top window will be six over six and others nine over nine, and that he intends to keep all materials that can be repaired, providing their condition is adequate. He noted that some material may be removed from the property to an off-site location for repairs in a climate-controlled environment, then returned and installed, and he mentioned that existing interior stairs would be replaced, as they are too steep for use.

Nancy Shoemaker confirmed with Mr. McClung that these repairs will be done with wood and that the arch window illustrations included with the application are merely examples of windows used elsewhere.

Additionally, it is noted that any deviation from the proposed plan, outlined on the application [clocked with the Town Clerk on June 22, 2017, at 2:59pm], will need to be reviewed by the Commission Chair.

Town of Barnstable, Burgess House, 559 Route 149, Marstons Mills, Map 079 Parcel 015 Historical Significance Confirmation

Represented by Mark Marinaccio, Town of Barnstable Architect

Town Architect Mark Marinaccio said he is seeking CPA funding for the Burgess House, and he provided a brief history of the structure.

Marilyn Fifield explained that the Community Preservation Act provides funding for historic buildings that are listed on the National or State Registers, but the Burgess House is not on any register, so a vote of the Barnstable Historical Commission confirming its importance to the community is needed to qualify it for CPA funding.

Chair Laurie Young moved, seconded by George Jessop, that the Burgess House at 559 Route 149, Marstons Mills, Map 079 Parcel 015, is a Preferably-preserved Significant Building.
