Certificate of Appropriateness Housing for All Corporation, 82 School Street, Hyannis, MA Map 327, Parcel 239-002 Represented by Paul Hebert

Modification to Approved Certificate of Appropriateness - Eliminate Pitched Roof

Mr. Hebert explained to the Commission that to construct the gable roof over the flat portion of the building will cost upwards of \$55,000 and they will never regain the costs in the use of the solar panels. There are racking systems available that will allow them to eliminate the gable roof and still utilize the system. Mr. Hebert presented diagrams of two racking systems; a high rise and a low rise and their engineering company tells them there is no real difference between the both. William Cronin suggested the lower pitch so that those coming down School Street would not see the view from behind. Mr. Cronin also asked if they could erect a false façade on the back of the panels. Mr. Hebert stated that it could be cost prohibitive, but added that if any problem with neighbors should arise, he would not be objectionable to a false façade. Barbara Flinn added that they have always been willing to work with their neighbors and this Commission.

Motion duly made by David Colombo, seconded by Joe Cotellessa to approve the Certificate of Appropriateness for the elimination of the gabled roof and using the low risers as presented.

New Sign to Replace Existing Sign

Barbara Flinn pointed out that since the sign will be made of wood, the rain can, over time, ruin the wood and would suggest added a cap to the top of the posts as well as to the sign itself. David Colombo would like to see a border around the sign in the same color gold of the lettering.

Motion duly made by William Cronin, seconded by Joe Cotellessa to approve the Certificate of Appropriateness as amended to accept the 2'x4' perpendicular sign with colonial caps on posts, cap on top of sign and ½" to ¾" border in gold around black sign with gold lettering made by Netzone.
