#### **RECREATION COMMISSION MINUTES**

#### 20 May 2013

# Commission Members Present: Joe O'Brien, Chairperson, Richard Sawyer, Kathy Pina and Steve Mele

Commission Members Absent: Rene King and Kevin Turner

The meeting was called to order at 5:32PM, roll call was taken. Joe O'Brien stated that Clyde Takala had resigned from the Commission and wished to thank Clyde for all his hard work and many years on the Commission; serving as Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson along with getting the building of the HYCC accomplished. Now have an opening on the Commission anyone interested may download the application from the Town's website under Town Council, if anyone would like to serve.

**Public Comment** – NONE

Proposed Swimming Pool, **Diane Klaiber** – Submitted following proposal and gave highlights to the Commission.

#### BARNSTABLE SWIMMING POOL PROPOSAL

#### **PURPOSE:**

To provide recreational water activities for **ALL** ages from babies to the elderly which is currently NOT offered in Barnstable, Sandwich, Yarmouth and Falmouth.

#### NEED:

- YMCA is the only 25-meter pool between the towns of Yarmouth, Barnstable, Sandwich and Falmouth whose total focus is families.
- Over 1/3 of Cape residents are retired without families. This number is growing!
- Residents are going off Cape to swim at the Wareham YMCA or Maritime Academy.
- Local schools cannot have a swim team as no place to practice. (Sturgis for one)
- YMCA is overcrowded and overused.
- Water at the YMCA is too cold for elderly unless you want the small pool but available times extremely limited due to swim lessons, parties, and family times.
- At times, only 1-2 lap lanes available for members at YMCA with 3-4 in a lane trying to swim.
- For a town and/or area this large, incomprehensible that we have 2 ice-skating rinks and no in-door pool.
- Water aerobics is an exercise for all ages.

- Everyone living on the Cape needs to know how to swim
- Ocean swimming warm enough for only 2-3 months at most during a year.

#### **PROGRAMS in Order of Importance:**

- Water aerobics during the day taught by certified instructors using the entire pool
- Lap swimming for ADULTS
- Programs for handicapped such as Parkinson's (currently there is no program specializing in this in spite of the number of people on the Cape with it
- Swim team practice at night which might include dive team, lifeguard instruction, scuba diving etc.
- Use by summer residents (rainy days and seniors)

#### COST:

Using preservation funds for piecemeal programs and for a limited population.

- Packet includes cost by Amer. Association Swimming Association. Annual cost of \$200,000.
- Talk to Sandwich and see if Barnstable could not share the cost of making the pool there useable again.
- Potential for a shared community resource for Falmouth, Barnstable and Sandwich.
- Need to build locker room and parking lot and fix the current pool in Sandwich.

## LOCATION:

- Sandwich High School allows for minimal cost for all towns but would need to be managed by town governance NOT school.
- Marstons Mills school where discussing Little League fields.
- Barnstable High School
- Hyannis Recreational Center?
- Senior Center
- Pavilion (For Sale on 28)

# My brother lives in Franklin, TN, and a town of 8000. There is a 25-meter pool open 7 days a week used for lap swimming and water aerobics and the swim team. He pays \$40 a year for unlimited swimming.

**Diane Klaiber** stated she would like the Commission to contact Sandwich to see if any towns on the Cape could share the cost of getting the pool up and running. **Kathy Pina** asked if the Sandwich pool under state guidelines. **Diane** not sure. **Richard Sawyer** stated isn't there hotels that supply swimming to the public. **Patti Machado** said three on the Cape. **Joe O'Brien** stated Falmouth has started a committee for a pool. **Diane Klaiber** stated if they are putting in fields at Marstons Mills school why not a pool. **Patti Machado** stated CPC being used for fields, outdoor use only for those funds. Discussion followed. The Commission recommended that **Diane** put a committee together, do further research, and contact Sandwich. **Kathy Pina** suggested talking to Mashpee also. Commission requested **Diane Klaiber** return for June agenda, if ready, if not then July's agenda.

**Staff Report, Joe Izzo** -handouts given (see attached) **Joe Izzo** stated planning a Father Daughter dance the Friday before Father's day, will hand out flowers to the daughters. June is showing to be a very busy month here, having an amateur boxing event, will have more information next month. Have Bikes on Ice for second year on Father's Day. Following weekend Gymport's spring/summer event, they are growing so big;

holding the event at HYCC. It is a great partnership, we send children to them and they send to us. Joe O'Brien asked who is doing the maintenance at the HYCC. Joe Izzo stated Steve Maderios is the facility manager and under him are three full time employees Scott, Josh and Blake. They are tasked with driving the Zamboni along with all maintenance of the building; they all do a great job. Richard Sawyer stated you have regularly scheduled staff meetings. Joe Izzo replied yes, 1PM on Thursdays. Discussion followed. Joe O'Brien stated the coaches should be responsible for locker room cleanup. Joe Izzo stated right now the focus is on making sure our staff is accountable and that our seasonal staff is doing what they should be doing. Richard Sawyer asked what the worse problem is. Joe Izzo stated regarding this situation, staffing. Discussion followed. Joe Izzo stated car keys are given for the locker room key but when busy there is no time to check the locker room before the locker room key is turned in, so we have no way of knowing who may have done any damage to the locker rooms. Kathy Pina stated maybe have the user groups let you know if the locker room is a mess when they come in after a messy group. Steve Mele asked is there a lot of damage in the shower area? Joes Izzo stated no. Joe O'Brien stated we meet with the BYHA at the start of every season; believe this issue should be brought then for discussion and solutions. Discussion followed. Joe O'Brien stated develop a very easy one page check list for each user group. Put BYHA on agenda for July or August, a representative from the board and also a representative for the coaches to discuss the issue.
