#### **AUGUST UPDATES...FROM THE TOWN CLERK**

Well summer is upon us and the fall elections are closing in – so we have a couple of reminders.

- √ For those of you who may have moved recently, please check with the Town Clerk's office (508-862-4044) to make sure we have your current address on file, if not, you need to update your address with us, so you will be able to vote. If you have not registered to vote please do so now. Last day to register for the **Thursday, September 8th State Primary** is on Friday, August 19, 2016, the office will be open until 8:00 PM.
- If you have students in your family who are going off to college, make sure they stop by or you stop by and pick up an absentee ballot application so that they can vote absentee from college if they are not registering to vote at their college community.
- √ Not sure if you are registered to vote? Call us better to check now than
  find out you are not on the voting list or that you are inactive. If you are
  inactive, you will need to prove you are still living in Barnstable.

#### REMINDER for DOG OWNERS....

You need to have dog licensed now. If you don't you will have to pay a \$5.00 late fee; but if you wait the late fee will go up. So license your animal now. It is worth it to license your dog. The fine for unlicensed dogs is **\$50.00**. You may license by mail – just send a copy of your current rabies certificate and a check for \$7 if the animal is spayed or neutered or \$10 if they are not (plus the \$5.00 late fee). Please include your email address so that we may remind you of the licensing period next spring.

#### **News from the Town Collector**

We hope you are having a safe, happy, and healthy summer!

The FY2017 Preliminary Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were issued and mailed on July 1, 2016. The following is the schedule for payments:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2017 Preliminary Tax Bills will be mailed by July 1, 2016

- √ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2016
- √ Second Quarter **due** November 2, 2016

#### Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 30, 2016

- √ Third Quarter due February 1, 2017
- √ Fourth Quarter due May 3, 2017

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks getting processed in a timely manner. This service is only for the "open" period of the bill, which means that once the due date is reached, you should mail the payment to The Town of Barnstable, PO Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 to avoid a delay.

If you use your own on-line bill payment process, would you kindly check and make sure that the proper address is used for the mailing address (Town of Barnstable, PO Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601)? These on-line checks must be processed manually and sending them to the Lockbox delays the processing.

Explore Expenditure Budgets: Amounts for 2017 are updated at the beginning of every week




**Summary:** The town of Barnstable's fiscal 2017 approved budget is available for public view on our Open Budget website. The town recently approved a \$181 million operating budget, which is down (0.07%) from fiscal 2016.

#### Explore Capital Budget: Appropriations for infrastructure and improvement projects.

#### 2016-089 Water Quality Schoolhouse Pond - \$55 thousand

**Description:** The goal is to place one solar power unit for water circulation in Schoolhouse Pond to disrupt the habitat for cyanobacteria. Schoolhouse Pond is listed as a chronic public health concern. The Barnstable Health Division and Massachusetts Department of Public Health have closed it to swimming the last two summers due to the toxic algae blooms and visibility of less than four feet. Toxic algae can cause skin and eye irritation and gastrointestinal illness. Children and pets are particularly at risk. The pond is listed as a high priority on the Action Plan for Barnstable Ponds 12/31/2009. Other project objectives include improvement to water quality, pH and oxygen fluctuations and fish habitat. Solar power units are currently being used with success in other Cape towns.

### **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS**

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

- 1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
- 2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
- 3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
- 4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

#### <u>Developing Your Emergency</u> <u>Disaster Plan</u>

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones.

When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

- 1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
- 2. What is your evacuation route.
- 3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
- 4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
- 5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
- What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters <u>DO NOT</u> allow pets.
- 7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
- 8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
- 9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

#### **The Emergency Survival Kit**

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ♦ A basic first aid kit.
- Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

## Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

- 1. Secure all outdoor objects.
- 2. Stay away from windows.
- 3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
- 4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
- 5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!

Barnstable Intermediate School, 895 Falmouth Road (Route 28), Hyannis (pets allowed)

Our designated Emergency Alert Radio Station is WQRC 99.9 FM. WBZ 1030 AM is the alternate station.

## Kennedy Legacy Walking Trail

The Kennedy Legacy walking trail guides visitors to 10 important Kennedy family sites in downtown Hyannis. At each site, an informational sign uncovers stories and history about the Kennedy's on Cape Cod. Sites include the Hyannis

Armory, where presidential candidate John F. Kennedy gave his acceptance speech, and the Kennedy's church, St Francis Xavier, where Rose Kennedy and other family members attended mass. Take the walking tour to gain an understanding of the Kennedy family's ties to Cape Cod.

The walking trail is 1.6 miles in one direction, and takes approximately 1 hour to complete. An additional 30 minutes should be allotted to walk back to the beginning of the trail.
