FROM THE TOWN MANAGER



Our Town Treasurer Debra Blanchette announced that the Town received competitive bids from bond and note underwriters on Tuesday, February 13, 2018, for a \$9,875,000, 20-year bond issue and a \$2,575,770, 1-year taxable note issue. Janney Montgomery Scott LLC was the winning bidder on the Bonds with an average interest rate of 2.73%. Century Bank was the winning bidder on the Notes with a net interest cost of 2.0%. The Town received a total of 10 bids on the Bonds and 5 bids on the Notes. Bond and Note proceeds will be used to finance various capital projects.

Prior to the sale, S&P Global Ratings, a municipal bond credit rating agency, affirmed the Town's 'AAA' bond rating, the highest rating attainable. The rating agency cited the Town's very strong economy, very strong management with strong financial policies and practices, strong budgetary performance, very strong budgetary flexibility, very strong liquidity, strong debt and contingent liability profile, and strong institutional framework as positive credit factors. Credit and thanks go to Mark Milne, our Finance Director, Debra Blanchette, Town Treasurer, and the Finance Department for their efforts.

The budgeting process continues. This is a year-round process, but this is when we finalize our needs. Our Senior Staff has submitted budget requests. We will keep performing at a high level and, as always, continue keeping a close eye on our spending. We will start with the Capital budget in early spring and then move on to the Operating budget.

The Barnstable Youth Commission is hosting the 4th Annual Community Substance Abuse Prevention Forum on Thursday, March 15th at 5:30 PM at Cape Cod Community College's Tilden Arts Center. The Barnstable Police Department will be providing a panel of officers to talk about what to look out for with your children. On Friday, March 16th, the entire seventh grade class will participate in the 4th Annual Youth Summit which will feature Dynamic Influence, Kevin Rosario from Gosnold of Cape Cod, and Barnstable High School's Peer Leaders and activities. It's a full day of learning while having fun and gaining tools for healthy decision making.

The calendar says that we will be "springing forward" on Sunday, March 11th and the first day of Spring is Tuesday, March 20th. I am ready to give Spring a hearty welcome!

NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

Many thanks to all that have returned the census forms. REMINDER: It is never too late to turn in your census form – remember if you have moved or anyone has moved in or out of the household – we need the current address where you or they are residing. Returning your census form to us, assures your information for voting is current.

The 2018 State Election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 6th. The Primary Election is scheduled for Tuesday, September 4th, the day after Labor Day. Remember your vote is your voice!

Dog licenses for 2018 will be ready for sale the 7th of May. HOWEVER, if you don't have a 2017 license you need to get it now. You cannot skip a year. Once your dog is 6 months old you need to get it licensed.

If you intend to purchase your dog tag by mail, please include a stamped self-addressed envelope along with your check made out to the Town of Barnstable (\$7.00 if spayed or neutered; or \$10.00 for male or female). Don't forget to send us a picture of your dog for the Barnstable's Best Dog Contest. The winning canine will earn the #1 dog tag and be featured on the website.

Fuel storage tank annual registrations will be going out in the mail in the month of March to those who have an existing fuel storage license.

FROM THE TOWN COLLECTOR'S OFFICE:

Just a friendly reminder: The third quarter real estate taxes and personal property taxes were due back on February 1st.

The first and largest commitment of 2018 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills were issued on February 21, 2018 and will be due on March 23, 2018. Once again, I would like to remind you that once a bill is issued, you must pay the bill or the bill must be abated as no bill just goes away. Please don't get caught up in paying additional fees and jeopardizing your driver's license! There are also a few 2017 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills being issued at the same time, which are delayed commitments from the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

The third quarter commitment of Utility Billing (sewer bills) was issued on February 26, 2018 and will be due on March 28, 2018.

Scholastic Art Awards



FLY TODAY AT HYA

A constant comment made to the Airport by many Cape and Island residents, second home owners and visitors is that flying to/ from Hyannis (Barnstable Municipal Airport or HYA) would the preferred way for air travel versus going to Boston's Logan International or Providence's T.F. Green Airport for business or vacation travel. Reoccurring comments are: 1) options are seasonal and leave off-peak travel at a disadvantage; and 2) more daily flights to/from Hyannis would allow for better connections to the larger national/international air system.

With these concerns in mind, the Airport wanted to collect feedback regarding air travel service. The goal of the air survey is to determine the air transportation needs for our Cape and Islands communities and to relay these needs to airlines with the intent of added additional passenger service.

The Airport serves as a distinct commercial transportation hub by meeting the regional demand for air transportation, providing travel opportunities from Hyannis to Boston and the islands of Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket; seasonal jet service between New York and Hyannis; and to other major destinations across the country. Cape Air/Nantucket Airways, Rectrix Shuttle, and JetBlue (seasonally) are our airline partners.

2018 OPEN SPACE AND RECREATION PLAN DRAFT FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The Barnstable Planning and Development Department invites the community to comment on the Town's Open Space and Recreation Plan during a public meeting on Thursday, March 8th at 6 pm in the Town Hall Selectmen's Conference Room at 367 Main Street, Hyannis. The department is holding a public meeting on the 2018 Barnstable

Open Space and Recreation Plan, which comprehensively examines Barnstable's open spaces and recreational facilities and outlines goals for land preservation, fostering agricultural activity, and enhancing active and passive recreation opportunities. Any Barnstable residents with comments about the plan which explores trails, beaches, ball fields, play areas, skating rinks, golf courses and simply preserving the beauty of Barnstable for future generations, are encouraged to attend.

At the public meeting, a brief overview of the 2018 Open Space and Recreation Plan will be presented to the public starting at 6 pm. Following the presentation, residents will have an opportunity to review the plan that covers the Town recreation, conservation and wildlife habitat areas and comment on what land preservation initiatives and recreation opportunities are important to them.

A copy of the 2018 Open Space and Recreation Plan is available for review on the Town Open Space and Recreation Plan website, found at www.town.barnstable.ma.us. The Planning and Development Department will be taking public comments on the plan between Friday, February 16, 2018 and Tuesday, March 12, 2018 at noon. Residents and community organizations are encouraged to review the plan and attend the public hearing with comments or questions.




